

Guest Speaker

Guest speaker **Tom Whitworth** was employed for 33 years as an environmental engineer with the State Department of Environment, retiring in 2008 as Manager, Industry Sustainability in the EPA. While his main expertise was in air pollution control, he participated at a senior in a number of key initiatives including greenhouse gas emissions, noise pollution, development assessment, waste and resource management, radiation management, small industry assistance and the container deposit legislation. In 2000 Tom was awarded the Public Service Medal in the Queen's Birthday Honours for his contribution to Air Quality Management.

Tom joined the Rotary Club of Mitcham in 1990. He and his wife Terri have a passion for animals and the natural environment which has taken them around the globe - they are dedicated volunteers at the Adelaide Zoo.

Tom and Terri visited Antarctica in 2007 on an 11 day trip out of Usaia in Argentina in a relatively small Russian made vessel carrying 110 passengers. They were fortunate to gain entry through the narrow Le Mairie passage which closes to 800m in places. He showed pictures of the scenery and wildlife. The scenery was dramatic with the high ice cliffs. Notable 'inhabitants' were the fur seals, the humpback whales and the Gentoo and Adeli penguins. All were very friendly. The whales suffered from foul breath; the penguins enjoyed pecking the passengers. They had been fortunate that the weather stayed relatively calm (only half the passengers suffered from sea sickness) and mild during the trip with a maximum temperature of 3C (but with wind-chill reducing it by up to 20C).

Cruises to this area were often beset by foul weather and minimal visibility. The ice can extend down to 3k below sea level in places. Global warming is already having an impact on sea and animal life. It is estimated that the penguin population has diminished by 25% in the last 2 decades. The Antarctic ice formation contains 2/3rds of the world's fresh water. In a worst case scenario sea levels could rise by 63 metres.

Questions followed the address and Tom was thanked in the normal Rotary fashion.
