Spots: Reminders

Alex Jonson: Chandra Sluggett's brother and sister have donated approximately 4 tonnes of export quality dried currents and various other goods to send to Timor Lesté. They have also donated \$13,000 towards the cost of shipping the container with the balance to be donated to another project of their choosing. We have arranged with the Rotary Club of Dili in conjunction with DIK to transport the goods. The balance of the container is to be filled with school desks, chairs etc supplied by DIK required by the Rotary Club of Dili.

We are in urgent need of a microscope, low level English picture books, readers for primary students, exercise books, old or new pencils, coloured pencils, children's clothing, (all types including winter & all sizes but mainly small sizes) etc..

We urgently require assistance from Rotary members to help clean, sort, pack and dismantle the desks and chairs and any other goods available at DIK to pack in the container.

We require 10 volunteers each day for the following dates:

Saturday & Sunday 28th & 29th August to clean, sort & pack the goods and Saturday & Sunday 4th & 5th September to load the container for shipping.

We are currently negotiating with DIK for more suitable times to avoid whole week ends.

Visit to the Metropolitan Fire Brigade

Following a meal at the Wakefield members attended the MFB across the road. Stephen Baker introduced Robert Prime, Senior Planner for the Metropolitan Southern Fire District. He was born in Lyndoch but decided greater there was opportunity in the city. He was recruited into the fire service through the South Adelaide Football (where he was an above average footballer) in 1986 at the age of 19. His current job to plan facilities, equipment and related activities in the expanding southern metro area. His qualifications include business administration and fire engineering.

The Fire Brigade started in 1852 and the premises in Wakefield St were completed in 1985. These facilities are still ranked among the best in the country, and compare favourably with those overseas.

There are 4 shifts run each day out of the centre which has 7 fire units, including one with a 37 metre expandable ladder. There are a further 19 units in the metro area and 17 in the ΑII country. brigade responses are predetermined. For example a fire in a high office/residential rise block in the city would initially command .3 appliances including the aerial (ladder). More call outs are for serious road

accidents – the crash vehicle is specially equipped with winches and cutters. The clothing and breathing apparatus are designed to enable survival for 16-17 seconds in a flash over and for much longer in a slower burning fire. Ken Daly refused to volunteer to slide down the pole from the sleeping area to the trucks dispatch area.

Hazardous chemicals are receiving increasing attention in training, choice of equipment (particularly breathing apparatus) and retardants. Only 3% of the 1000+ fire fighting force are women but the number is slowly growing. The standard response time for a metro fire is 6 minutes. Recruiting is no longer age restrictive – greater attentions is paid to teamwork and physical capacity. The city station receives a call out most nights. Facilities visited included the trucks, the Hazmat section, the training area where smoke and darkness simulations are conducted, and the fitness/gym areas.

Robert Prime was thanked in the usual Rotary fashion!
