He was very involved with DIK.

Guest Speaker: Michelle Morton - E-WASTE

Our guest speaker, Michelle Morton, was introduced by Chairperson Heather Kilsby. She is the Director of E-Cycle Recovery, a socially responsible electronic waste recycling company.

Electronic waste has become a large global problem due to repair costs exceeding replacement cost, planned obsolescence and tax deductibility. Electronic waste items are designed to be disposed of not dismantled or recycled. Approximately 234 million computers, televisions and mobile phones were thrown out last year.

It costs money to recycle. Up to 95% of each item is able to be dismantled and the materials sent for reuse into new items. Councils' Hard Waste Collection = Landfill; 34% of televisions in SA disposed of via this method alone.

Current disposal methods for electronic waste by scrap metal recyclers, local recycling centre's, computer refurbishes and not for profit groups are landfill and shipping overseas. If shipped overseas to countries like China it is dumped there as landfill. In areas where this happens the toxic results is that the land can no longer be farmed and the water is no drinkable.

Less than 6% of all e-waste in Australia is recycled

E-CYCLE RECOVERY was established December 2005, processing 400 tonnes of electronic waste last year. Their main customer base is the general public and councils.

They have won BEC Australia Awards for Best Micro Business, Recipient of a Business Environment Award, Recipient of a Business Environment Award and Winner of an ANZ Small Business Award.

In 2009 Michelle is the founded CRT Recycling Australia, which is the first plant in Australia and New Zealand to process cathode ray tube (CRT) glass from television and computer screens.

Youth programs help enhance Rotary's public image

Rotary has many youth programs. The programs for younger participants, such as Interact and Rotary Youth Exchange, are not funded by The Rotary Foundation, but they all give Rotary a very positive public image, which The Rotary Foundation benefits from. They are also very important to The Rotary Foundation, as the participants get their first contact with Rotary, which can lead to future membership in a Rotary club and, hopefully, becoming a contributor to The Rotary Foundation.

The programs for older participants, such as Ambassadorial Scholarships, Group Study Exchange, and Rotary Peace Fellowships, are funded by The Rotary Foundation. Of special interest to me is the Rotary Centers for International Studies in peace and conflict resolution — a program that one day might become the jewel in the Rotary programs crown. We have a fundraising effort running for this program — the USD95 million campaign — which must not be forgotten in our ambition to increase contributions to the Annual Programs Fund and Permanent Fund and to meet Rotary's USD200 Million Challenge.

All our youth programs are peace programs. In particular, our Youth Exchange participants act as ambassadors of peace when going to a totally new environment. We ask a lot from them, and we can be very proud of them.

All our students – younger or somewhat older, at home or abroad – participate in local projects, thus *Building Communities – Bridging Continents* through Service Above Self.

E-mail scams targeting Rotarians

Rotary International News -- 3 September 2010

Rotary International continues to receive notice of e-mail phishing scams targeting Rotarians.

Some scams claim to be from RI in Great Britain and Ireland or say that the recipient has been selected in a raffle for a prize and the recipient's contact information is needed. Another scam still circulating claims that a deceased Rotarian has left money to the e-mail recipient to be donated to philanthropic efforts. The sender, who claims to be the executor of the will, then asks for the recipient's personal information, including a copy of the individual's passport and driver's license, in order to claim the inheritance.

Here is an example of one scam that is circulating:

Last and Final Notification of Bequest

Congratulation!

On behalf of the Trustees and Executor of the estate of Late Rotarian Mark Andreoni, I write to notify you that my late client made you a beneficiary to the bequest sum of Ten Million US Dollars in the codicil to his will and last testament.

My client decided to bequeath his estate to a fellow member of Rotary Club with a good track record. Rotarian Mark Andreoni (late) before his demise has no child nor wife to bequeath his estate to. In view of that, Rotarian Mark Andreoni (late), made you a beneficiary in his will. Rotarian Mark Andreoni, died on 14th day February 2006 after a brief illness. Until his death he wasconsultant to several oil and gas industries. He had a sojourn in the United States and so many other countries before he came to Cairn Energy PLCan oil and gas exploration and production company based in the United Kingdom. MyClient, Rotarian Mark Andreoni was the president of Rotary Club of ABINGDON-ENGLAND, with club number: 0000039890, District: 1180, he was a dedicated Christian and a philantropist.

This bequest is to support your activities, humanitarian services and help to the less-privileged.

Please if you receive this email as expected, you should endeavor to get back to me as soon as possible to enable me conclude my legal duty, you should forward along your current telephone and fax numbers, your current occupation,

age and mailing address. Also to be sent to me is the biodata page of your international passport or drivers licence as a proper identification.

Once again, I congratulate you for this is a significant honor indeed.
