Lindsay England reiterated Pres. Sheila's remarks that we still need more volunteers to fill mid-week roster spots in the Thrift Shop.

There is a problem with the hot water system in the Thrift Shop. It appears to have blown a valve and has been leaking profuse amounts of water. Fortunately, there has been no damage that we know of to stock, fixtures or fittings. Tom Tirrell kindly came and closed off the system and halted further leakage, but until our landlady organises a plumber to fix the system properly there will be no reticulated hot water available in the shop.

Euan Miller has District responsibility for international students and brought Stephen Chen along to introduce him to the Unley club as it was the nearest to Stephen's home. Stephen has expressed a keen interest in volunteering to help on Rotary projects.

Guest Speaker - Bob Arnold: "Calperum Station"

Chairman Jerry Casburn introduced Bob Arnold from of the Rotary Club of Blackwood to speak on the subject of Calperum Station.

Calperum Station and Taylorville Station are pastoral leases near Renmark in South Australia, comprising of 242,800 and 92,600 hectares of predominantly open mallee bushland and Murray River floodplains. They form part of Riverland Biosphere Reserve, which is located in the Riverland area of South Australia. The Riverland Biosphere Reserve was previously known as the 'Bookmark' Biosphere Reserve, a name derived from the Aboriginal word *Pukumako* meaning flint stone axe or sandstone grit hole.

Calperum and Taylorville are important locally, nationally and internationally because of their intact mallee vegetation, the presence of several threatened bird species, and their wetlands and related species. The properties form critical habitat for the endangered black-eared miner (*Manorina melanotis*). They are also important for the conservation of the nationally vulnerable malleefowl (*Leipoa ocellata*), the regionally vulnerable bush stone-curlew (*Burhinus grallarius*) and the nationally vulnerable southern bell frog (*Litoria ramiformis*).


Calperum Station with its significant mallee and Murray River wetlands, was purchased by the Chicago Zoological Society in 1993 with assistance from the Australian Government. Taylorville Station was purchased by the Australian Landscape Trust in 2000, with assistance from the Australian Government, as an addition to the Riverland Biosphere Reserve. Both properties are deeded to the Director of National Parks.

The Mallee scrubland of Australia is one of the most endangered vegetation types in the world, with approximately 80 per cent cleared for agriculture in the past 150 years. The Mallee, like many parts of Australia, has not responded well to imposed European-style land use. In the past the fragile soils and vegetation have been overexposed to grazing and inappropriate land use.

Calperum and Taylorville Stations are managed by the Australian Landscape Trust under contract to the Director of National Parks.

Calperum and Taylorville Stations provides opportunities for educational programs, training programs and nature-based recreational activities including camping, picnicking, bush walking canoeing and bird watching. Visitors are also able to view land recovery and species restoration programs on site.

The flora and fauna of the region must be adaptable to tolerate low erratic rainfall and extremes of temperature ranging from minus 2°C over night to 16°C during winter. The summers are long with temperatures ranging from warm to hot. Temperatures in excess of 40°C are common.

Under permits Rotarians from around Australia have been assisting in revegetating the property while enjoying fun and fellowship. Several Rotary clubs have taken on specific projects such as mapping Calperum Station, quarterly checking of bore water salinity, revegetation of target sites and removal of fencing.

After responding to a number of questions and providing assurances that mice were not a problem, Chairman Jerry thanked Bob for his talk and presented him with a pen as a memento of his visit to RC Unley.

Rotarians play key role in Pakistan's strategy to end polio

Rotarians are in the forefront of the drive to implement Pakistan's National Emergency Action Plan for Polio Eradication 2011. The government launched the plan in January, in response to a sharp increase in polio cases in the country in 2010.

Turning the tide against the disease in Pakistan is pivotal to the success of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative . Pakistan was the only one of the world's four polio-endemic countries -- the others are Afghanistan, India, and Nigeria -- to see an increase in cases last year: 144 compared with 89 in 2009.

Rotarians assigned by the Pakistan PolioPlus Committee are mobilizing Rotary clubs to provide support in the country's four provinces. Rotarians are helping to immunize children against polio and to raise public awareness of the disease.

Club members are working "to cover every nook and corner of the country," says Aziz Memon, chair of the committee. "We are committed to a polio-free Pakistan."

Rotarians are also advocating for polio eradication among officials at all levels of government, as well as religious leaders and others.

"Aziz Memon is a participant in meetings with the president, regional governors, and health advisers," said Bill Gates at the 2011 RI Convention in May. "Rotary is in the room when decisions are made in Pakistan." Gates is co-chair of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, which has awarded US\$355 million in challenge grants to Rotary for polio eradication efforts.

Mental illness can affect anyone at any age and is close to becoming an invisible epidemic, affecting one in five Australians every year. So fast is this problem growing that depression and anxiety are expected to become the world's leading cause of disability within the next eight years. This year, mental health was put back in the spotlight when the Federal Government invested \$2.2 billion over a five year period into mental health services, allowing the 1500 people on average turned away from psychiatric units and emergency rooms each day another possible avenue of treatment

The success of these services is heavily reliant on the research funded through donations to organisations such as Australian Rotary Health who allow mental health professionals to stay informed of the most recent research findings in areas of mental health. Australian Rotary Health is Australia's largest non-government funding body for mental illness research. Thanks to the generous support of Rotarians Australia wide over the past 30 years, Australian Rotary Health has raised over \$26 million in donations that have facilitated better treatment and services for all Australians, in particular those who are least able to assist themselves.

In the past year alone, researchers funded by Australian Rotary Health have unearthed links between symptoms of depression and anxiety and dietary habits, as well as discovered depression to be a long term side effect of other ill-nesses such as cancer. By continuing to fund research that uncovers possible causes of mental illness, Australian Rotary Health brings the possibility of prevention all the more closer.
