Guest Speaker

Dr Andrew Southcott MP on the new Cancer Centre at FMC

Chairman Wendy Andrews introduced Dr Andrew Southcott MP. Andrew Southcott grew up at Somerton Park, and began school at Paringa Primary before moving to St Peter's College. He studied Medicine at the University of Adelaide graduating in 1991. In 1989 he became president of the Adelaide Medical Student society and later that year moved overseas as a volunteer at a hospital in Kwakzulu/Natal South Africa. He completed his internship at the RAH and undertook surgical training including a surgical registrar at the Breast Cancer Unit at Flinders.

In 1994 he became the endorsed Liberal candidate for Boothby. In addition to his medical studies Andrew has completed a degree in economics and a MBA. Following the 2007 elections, Andrew was appointed to the opposition front bench and is presently the Shadow Parliamentary Secretary for Primary Healthcare. On a personal note Andrew is married to Kate and has two children.

The theme of his speech was that local MPs have a responsibility to enhance their electorates and when governments are not of their persuasion it requires significantly greater effort to achieve success. In Andrew's case there were two major projects which he pursued over a number of years – the Marion Aquatic Centre and a Cancer Centre at the Flinders Medical Centre. There was support for both under the Howard Government, but that could have changed with the election of the Rudd government. Fortunately through persistent effort and widespread collaboration both have succeeded. Andrew gave us some behind the scene information regarding the Marion

Council budget proposal for a swimming pool with private and public funding, and how the project managed to proceed.

Flinders Medical Centre was designed as the first fully integrated teaching hospital and medical school in Australia. In 2003 the idea of further innovation, that is, an integrated Cancer Centre began. Sydney and Melbourne already had funding for such a project and in the 2006 budget, \$10,000,000 was granted for a centre at Flinders. A new building is now complete. The centre will attract researchers from around the world, and will be focused on an holistic patient care approach. Andrews started working in this field and it has been his long term dream to help bring this centre to fruition. The centre will be officially opened on the 26th April 2012

Rotary International signs project partner agreement with ShelterBox

Rotary International and <u>ShelterBox</u>, a grassroots disaster relief organization, signed a project partner agreement this month, allowing the two organizations to collaborate more closely to provide relief and temporary shelter to survivors of natural disasters.

"Project partner" is a special status RI gives to groups started or managed by Rotary clubs. The agreement will build on the strengths of both organizations in responding to disasters all over the world.

"Our Rotary friends have always been there ready to assist – from generous donations to direct operational support on the ground Rotary has always been part of our DNA," said Tom Henderson, ShelterBox CEO. "I feel like we have 34,000 ShelterBox offices around the world working together to help those who have lost everything when they need us the most."

Saving lives

RI General Secretary John Hewko said the agreement will enable Rotary club members to have an immediate, lifesaving impact in communities hit by natural disasters. "ShelterBox will be able to ensure that local Rotarians are provided an opportunity to participate in the distribution of ShelterBox containers," he said.

Each ShelterBox typically provides a tent designed to withstand extreme weather conditions, stove, water purification kit, blankets, tools, and other necessities to help a family survive for six months or more after a disaster.

Henderson, a civil engineer and former search-and-rescue diver for the British Royal Naval, founded ShelterBox in 2000. Its response teams of trained volunteers have brought lifesaving supplies to victims of more than 175 disasters in nearly 80 countries.

Mutual goals

"For more than 10 years, ShelterBox has given light to over one hundred thousand families worldwide in their darkest hour," said Hewko. "This project partner agreement represents our mutual goal of helping those in need. It gives RI a forward-facing approach to immediate disaster relief."

Henderson noted, "This partnership with Rotary International is a formal recognition of our good work over the past 12 years. It will help Rotarians get a better understanding of what we do. I hope Rotarians worldwide will see us as a coherent and able disaster relief organization."

Earlier this month, a ShelterBox team distributed more than 550 tents to communities in Madagascar where powerful cyclones left more than 250,000 people homeless.
