

Guest Speaker - Alan Reid & Ali Douglas:

The Australian Foundation for Fostering Learning in the Philippines

Chair person Jerry Casburn introduced speakers Professor Alan Reid and Alistair Douglas. Alan is Professor Emeritus of Education at the University of South Australia where he has been a lecturer and researcher, as well as holding administrative positions such as Dean of Education and Director of Research Centres. Alan has published widely in such areas as educational policy, social justice and education, citizenship education and the history and politics of public education. Alan has been recognized with a number of awards, including the McKillop Medal, the Alby Jones Medal and the Gold Medal of the Australian Council of Educational Leaders. In the Australia Day 2012 awards he was made a Member of the Order of Australia. Alan is married to Liz and they have three children and two grandchildren. Interests are playing over 60s cricket, bowls and writing a history of the Adelaide Crows.

Alistair has a history in education serving overseas, as well as at home, in the Middle East, Asia and has spent extensive periods in the Philippines. Alistair is married to Robyn, they have two children, a son who lives in Cape Town and a daughter living in New York; a truly cosmopolitan family. Alan has a small farm in Bordertown.

Alan and Alistair were both selected for Group Study Exchanges in Texas and Finland respectively, the latter despite being a member of Apex.

Alan and Alistair were both at Uni together and then lost touch over subsequent years. Both returned to Adelaide and met again. A strong desire to do good in the world led to the development of the "Australian Foundation for Fostering Learning In the Philippines" (AFFLIP). This new organisation, developed in the last year, has the objective of making a contribution to the educational development of young people living in some of the poorest parts of the Philippines. AFFLIP's focus is on learning; its various programs involve fundraising to provide physical facilities and learning resources for schools, linking with other agencies, to promote the health and nutrition of students, and supporting professional development for teachers.

Alistair spoke of experiences in Davao City on the island of Mindanao where 75% of the local inhabitants are below the poverty line. Alistair experienced the "Fragility of Life" when a young woman working for him had a son infected by Dengue fever, Alistair paid for necessary blood transfusions but to no avail when the son died.

Alan explained AFFLiP's premise that raising the levels of education, relieves poverty, increases life expectancy, and reduces crime thereby increasing peace.....a desire close to Rotary hearts with this year's theme of "Peace Through Service".

AFFLIP has formed a volunteer Board with a wide range of expertise from accounting to agronomy as well as education.

PS It must be said that Jerry's startling revelation (when introducing the guest speakers) that he struggles with long words casts some doubt on the quality of the UK education system.

On the lighter side.....a little bit of sweet seduction

Portuguese pastries will sweeten your convention experience

After sinking your teeth into the soft, custardy center of a flaky *travesseiro*, you might wonder why Portuguese pastries are not as celebrated as their French counterparts. Rotarians attending the 2013 RI Convention in Lisbon, 23-26 June, will be able to sample these delights and decide for themselves.

Lisbon's Belém district offers much to see, including the Belém Tower and Jerónimos Monastery. It also has a signature sweet called *pastel de Belém*, a petite tart sprinkled with cinnamon and powdered sugar that, with a cup of coffee, provides a perfect break from sightseeing. Using a well-guarded recipe, a bakery called Antiga Confeitaria de Belém has made *pastéis de Belém* since 1837. The recipe was first created by nuns at the Jerónimos Monastery. You can find similar treats, called *pastéis de nata*, all over Portugal.
