

POOTY Presentation Ceremony in Rundle Mall

Proceedings for the presentation of the South Australia Police Officer of the Year 2012 opened in the presence of the Acting Police Commissioner Grant Stevens, DG Roy Armstrong, the Police Band, and a good sized crowd at 12.30pm in the Rundle Mall.

President Stephen Westgarth announced that Sergeant John Illingworth from Road Safety Section was the 2012 recipient of the award. John joined the Force in 1979 and after some years of patrol work became a Police prosecutor. In 1988 he was promoted to Sergeant and handled prosecutions for a large area of the State from the Port August Station. He left the Force from 1991 -1997 and then returned to again undertake prosecution work. In 2007 he was appointed as the Road Safety Program Coordinator.

His first task was to restore effective communications with the public through the media, which on all accounts he has managed particularly well....with courtesy, understanding and humour. New programs were initiated dealing with better understanding of the road rules and human factors which affect driving performance. He has played a key role in guiding legislation to do with Street Racing and Graduated licensing. Road safety displays have been set up across the State including remote localities such as Moonta. Voluntary breath testing stations were set up at the Schoolies Festival 2012 which prevented 37 novice drivers taking to streets while under the influence of alcohol.

State Government programs such as its Road Safety Strategy 'Towards Zero Together', 'Living Neighbourhoods' which is about creating people friendly and safer roads, and 'Way2Bike Ed' have all benefitted from his advice and assistance.

He is now in charge of the new SAPOL Road Safety Centre which he helped to design and which will play an important role in childhood road safety education. Recently he teamed up with Humphrey B Bear to develop a kids' road safety video. He has worked with the Royal Institute of Australia to meld road trauma case studies with science to achieve a better understanding of

dangerous driving – secondary school science teachers are being used to sell the message in our schools. No demographic group in the State has been immune from his efforts to improve road safety and drive down the death and injury toll. He has been at the forefront of saving lives.

He has been described as an excellent communicator through plain speaking and appropriate humour, an outstanding networker, inspiring, innovative, tireless and dedicated a team player, always helpful and highly effective.

President Stephen presented the POOTY citation and shield to Sergeant Illingworth, and thanked all those involved in the organisation of the event.

In response John mentioned that his first assignment as a cadet in 1979 was with Road Safety and his mentor Wally Garrett won the Police Officer of the Year 1979. He spoke about Road Safety being a partnership between police and the community and the efforts being made to improve driver behaviour. He thanked our club for the award.

Acting Police Commissioner Grant Stevens congratulated John on his award and provided further detail of his efforts to improve road safety. He thanked the Rotary Club of Unley and stressed the importance of the award in promoting the good works of police officers to the public.

The ceremony concluded at 12.50pm

POOTY Dinner - Glenelg Golf Club

MC David Middleton commenced proceedings at 7.30pm - background music was provided by the Police Band duet of the 'Two Dads'.

President Stephen Westgarth formally opened the meeting and welcomed guests, including David Pisoni MP, Acting Deputy Police Commissioner Bronwyn Killmier, other police officers, Unley Deputy Mayor Bob Schnell, DG Roy Armstrong, DGE Wendy Gaborit, AG Mark Huddleston, Rotarian visitors from Blakiston, Eastwood, Hyde Park and Mitcham clubs, and members and guests of Unley Rotarians.

DG Roy Armstrong explained the effort made by Rotary International to rid the world of polio. Prior to the intervention by Rotary, polio was infecting and maiming hundreds of thousands of people across the globe. Today there were only 27 cases reported and India had been polio free for 2 years. The program would continue until polio is completely defeated.

A video provided by POOTY 2011 awardee Carol Bristow was played in her absence overseas and she extolled the worth of POOTY to her and the Force.

Chairman Stephen Baker provided a brief background to

the award. This is the 175th birthday of SA Police and the 35th year of the award. He announced the South Australia Police Officer of the Year 2012 was, for the reasons expressed in the Mall ceremony (see above), Sergeant John Illingworth from Road Safety Section.

President Stephen presented John with the citation, POOTY shield and POOTY uniform badge.

John Illingworth, in his response, added to his remarks in the Mall, and stressed the need to maintain educational effort and to find new ways of engaging the public, particularly in modifying driver behaviour. The new Road Safety Centre at Thebarton was proving very popular and by year end it is expected 10,000 people would have visited it. Engaging people from a young age was vital to improve attitudes and awareness. He thanked the club for his award.

Acting Deputy Commissioner Bronwyn Killmier, in accepting the perpetual shield from President Stephen, congratulated John and the road safety endeavour of the Force, stressed the importance of this award, and thanked our club. Both John and Bronwyn were given standing ovations.

Rotary News

Shelter Boxes

Rotarians are often <u>ShelterBox</u>'s first point of contact on the ground following a disaster. From helping assess disaster impact, to housing response team volunteers, to helping coordinate relief logistics, Rotarians provide vital assistance to ShelterBox Response Teams (SRTs). Rotary and Rotaract clubs have been working with ShelterBox to help communities in dire need of assistance immediately following a disaster since the organization's inception in 2000. Recently:

- In January 2013, the <u>Rotary Club of Gosford North</u>, Australia, raised funds to equip storm-hit regions of Madagascar with hundreds of blankets, water purification kits, clothes, school supplies, and volunteered during on-site distribution of needed supplies. Local Rotarians in Madagascar provided instrumental logistical support for local ShelterBox deployments.
- Rotary clubs in Jordan have been working with ShelterBox and Jordanian authorities to organize rest camps for Syrian refugees in March 2013 as travel through Jordan to seek protection in Lebanon.
- Following heavy flooding in eastern Uganda, Rotarians from Mbale used Facebook to request ShelterBox's
 assistance in late March 2013. With the support of local Rotarian contacts, ShelterBox quickly mobilized relief kits the
 first week of April to communities impacted by severe storm damage.
