Further Australian Support for Polio Eradication: Prime Minister Julia Gillard and Foreign Minister Bob Carr today announced further funding to help eradicate polio – a debilitating disease that continues to strike the world's most vulnerable people, especially children. Australia will provide \$80 million over four years from 2015 to 2018 to help finish the job and achieve worldwide polio eradication.

This contribution follows a \$50 million commitment to the Global Polio Eradication Initiative from 2011 to 2014 announced by the Prime Minister at the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting in Perth in October 2011. The Prime Minister

and the Foreign Minister applauded the leadership shown by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, the World Health Organization, UNICEF and Rotary International on polio. The Gates Foundation is contributing US\$1.8 billion for *the Polio Endgame Strategic Plan 2013 - 2018*, which is one-third of the total budget.

Australia has a proud history of support for polio eradication. From 1912 to 1972, more than 30,000 cases of paralytic poliomyelitis were reported in Australia, and a number of polio survivors in Australia today still live with the pain and debilitation of post-polio syndrome.

It was Australia's Sir Clem Renouf who, as President of Rotary International in 1978 and 1979, led the international campaign to vaccinate every child against polio. As a result of these early efforts by Rotary, the global community came together in 1988 to launch the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.

Since 1988, there has been a reduction in the number of polio cases by 99.9 per cent. Following the certification of India as polio-free in 2012, polio remains endemic in only Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nigeria. The world now has polio eradication within its reach. This would be the second disease to be eradicated globally after small pox and a major victory for international aid and public health. The new contribution brings Australia's total commitment to polio eradication to over \$130 million. Our aim is to help eradicate polio and strengthen routine immunisation.

Guest Speakers – Aileen and Paul Munn on Cambodia

Chairman Mavis Martin introduced Aileen and Paul Munn of the famous Munn's Lawns. They came to the club to talk about their Cambodian project.

Aileen explained that she and her husband Paul had travelled to Cambodia in 2006 and upon visiting a dump near Phnom Penh were staggered and appalled by the conditions under which families were living and attempting to scrounge a living. 3-4 people die each week due to the toxic waste.....for a reward of little more than 50c per day.

To provide practical assistance they gave bags of rice. To improve the futures of these families they decided with the collaboration of the Bridges of Hope organization and US Habitat to build a small village about 40km from the city to house 21 families (125 people in all) with a school, church and community centre. Plans were made to deliver a sustainable future away from the dump by training families in agriculture and enterprise.

A video was shown of a television segment covering the efforts made by the Munns, and the challenges in Cambodia.

Paul Munn then explained his passion for Cambodia and its people. It was an 'unlucky country' which had been ravaged by Pol Pot who had murdered 2.5 people, including most of the country's elite thinkers, business people and teachers. He said the gap between rich and poor was growing with those close to the country's leaders benefitting from corrupt practices. He was pleased with the building of 3 churches and the efforts of Brighton High School to sponsor a secondary school in the Udong area. He and Aileen had now made 18 visits.

Aileen and Paul were thanked by acclamation for their presentation and given the cherished rotary pen.

The winners of our eighth annual photo contest The Rotarian -- June 2013

Carol Guzy has won four Pulitzer Prizes – more than any other photographer or journalist – so she has a unique perspective on what separates a great photo from a good one. In addition to sitting for an interview with *The Rotarian*, she agreed to judge the photo contest this year.

First place: On the bus to Lushoto near Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. Guzy says “This is a poignant, compelling image that evokes nostalgia. Perfectly composed, with subtle tones of black and white that enhance a feeling of bygone days, the wistful expression on the boy and his reflection provide a quiet, intimate moment.

For the first-place winner, Guzy chose an image captured by Spencer Callahan in Tanzania last summer. Callahan was on a bus, sitting behind two little boys and their father. “I was showing them the pictures I was taking, and they loved it,” he recalls. “As we got closer to the mountains, this boy became fascinated with the scenery. I held up the camera and didn’t even look through the viewfinder, because I didn’t want him to stop doing what he was doing.” Callahan won a Nikon D3200 SLR with a lens. The second- and third-prize winners received Canon SX210 IS cameras.
