Chandra provided an excellent presentation of international club projects in which the club has been involved in recent years. We have ranged around the developing world with projects in India (sustainable farming for tribal village), Thailand (education and health), Cambodia and Vietnam (babies), Sri Lanka (renal care, artificial hands and orphanage IT), Brazil (bus for homeless and equipment for disabled), Nepal (snow glasses) and Timor Leste (numerous DIK containers and teacher training).

AG Bob Cooper responded to the toast by reflecting on his recent collection of goods from the Salvos nursing home for transmission to East Timor through DIK, the advances in Polio Plus with only Afghanistan and Pakistan to be cleansed, and the positive impact of the International Conference.

In a 'double act', Patsy proposed the toast to partners and Graham responded by quoting from Kirk Douglas.....and Colin Schirmer was lauded for his 30 years of Rotary service.

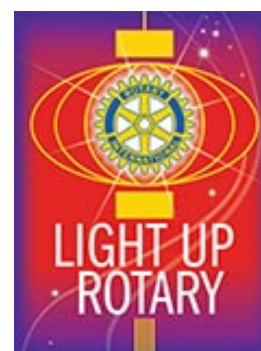
'Last day DG' Jerry Casburn reflected on his year at the helm of D9520, and the 29,000 kilometres travelled to 51 clubs. His only regrets were the closure of RC Brighton, District membership reducing from 1354 to 1340 and hitting a kangaroo. Highlights have included working with an excellent District team, hosting an outstanding conference, making lasting friendships with 21 other DGs across Australia, celebrating 110 years of Rotary, ramping up the exchange student program, Rotary Race Day, forming a Rotaract club, administration events at Calperum and Mildura, Nomads formation, first-hand knowledge of the signature programs of each club (including the tiny McLaren Vale group) and the East Timor educational advancement program. Briony has been a tower of strength. Club members were lauded for their support.

President Joan Reed thanked committee members for their efforts in 2014/15. Her magic moments were the District Conference, and particularly the team work of members and partners to make it a success, and the 80th birthday celebration at the Conference. We will soon see shelter and seating at Fraser Park. Our debate and quiz successes were good, but the bowls will not be discussed; in any event, '2 out of 3 aint bad'.

It has been a busy and productive year for the club. In Community Service there were many events including the Carols, Christmas gifts, Fraser Park, a bike for disabled twins, Helping Hands, defibrillator, Bramwell House and Rufus. International provided 4 shelter boxes, orphanage IT project in Sri Lanka, the Timor Leste VTT project and Days for Girls, and more.
