Guest Speaker – Marcus Ferrari: Cranes at the Oval

Valerie Bonython introduced Marcus Ferrari; Marcus being the brother of her son-in-law David. Marcus is in partnership with his brother and their company is 'Ferrari Brothers, Crane & Rigging'. The company does not advertise and secures constructions according to the tender process. The latest tender has been the completion of the Adelaide Oval Redevelopment Project, South Stand. This is the company's 'most iconic' construction. Previous iconic constructions it takes credit for are major parts of Adelaide Airport and The Advertiser Building. The two brothers have different roles. David runs each major project on site. Marcus is responsible for tenders, job finding and allocation, satellite work and on-site work.

Marcus illustrated the project via a video. This showed the demolishing, preparing and developing of the new area. Much of the video was presented in a manner similar to fast forward mode, so within 10 minutes the South Stand was a 'fait accompli'!!

Some interesting facts and figures are the roof weighs more than 960 tons the stand 920 tons, the length of the roof 150 meters and roof width 75 meters; seating capacity is 14,000. Marcus does not drink alcohol, smoke or gamble. However he confessed to being a hopeless chocaholic and pepsi maxaholic. He further confessed to their consumption, plus products from the North Adelaide Bake house to be rivaling the above figures. Certainly he looks the picture of health!!

The work was six weeks late in commencing due to wet weather conditions. There were round the clock shifts for the construction workers. Marcus was going to the site at 1.30am to be there for deliveries arriving between 2am and 4am for weeks on end. Items used in the construction have all been manufactured in Adelaide. Despite the late start, the South Stand was completed within the set time frame and the construction came in on budget.

For a man who describes himself as a 'rigger who puts bolts in holes' Marcus certainly has a talent which is making its presence visible in Adelaide.

Valerie presented Marcus with a gift. It certainly was not a pen judging by the size of the parcel. Maybe chocolates!!!!

Under One Sky lights the way to a better world

Rotary and ONE, an international advocacy organization, joined other event partners in downtown Chicago on 24 September to demonstrate a commitment to ending extreme poverty and inequality and to promoting action on climate change on the eve of the United Nations launch of its Sustainable Development Goals.

The [17 ambitious goals](#) constitute a road map for finding solutions to the world's most pressing problems, and dovetail with Rotary members' work to create positive change in their communities and around the world. As dusk fell over Chicago, participants in the Under One Sky event held up blue lights, transforming the plaza where they were gathered into a field of fireflies to #LightTheWay to a more just world.

"This is a great opportunity for people to network and join an event where we are all focused on creating a better world," said Cheryl McIntyre, president of the Rotary Club of Chicago.

Julie Bordo, a district representative for ONE.org, noted that Rotary and ONE are more effective when they work together.

"We have very similar goals, and when we put our collective efforts together, it allows us to reach more people in addressing these incredibly important issues," she said.

Under One Sky Chicago was one of more than 40 such events planned in the United States and more than 150 around the world. Other cities that hosted them include Sydney, New Delhi, Johannesburg, São Paulo, and New York.

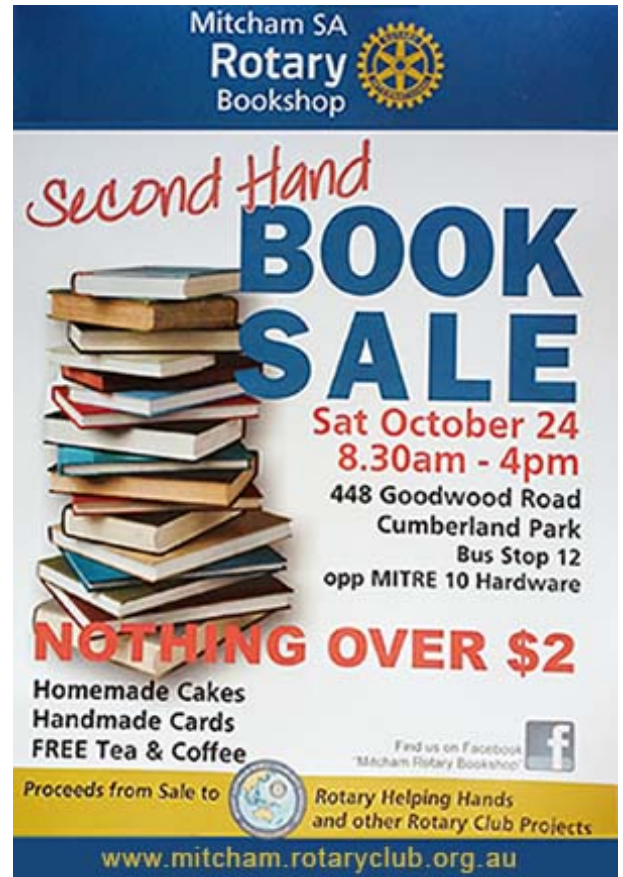
