Guest Speakers: Ian Cox Hutt St Centre

Glamorous Chairman Mavis Martin introduced Ian who is the CEO of the Hutt Street Centre. The Centre is a front line service for homeless and vulnerable people in the inner city and eastern region of Adelaide. Ian began with the centre as a social worker 23 years ago and became CEO in 2003. In 2008/9 he was seconded to the Department of Families and Communities to develop a State response to the Commonwealth Government's Homelessness Strategy. He helped target housing assistance for the homeless and those with mental health issues. Ian has been a member of and chaired Unity Housing Company, which now has a portfolio of over 1800 properties serving the needy. He has a BA, a Bachelor of Social Administration and is a Fellow of the Leadership Institute.

lan said that perhaps his proudest moment was to extract a Government commitment to help the homeless as part of the 2008/9 strategy development. Hutt St serves 50000 meals a year and has a case-load of 1300 people, of which 105 are over the age of 65. Hutt Street was all about feeding and sheltering the homeless until a survey of its clientele revealed that 70%

could not read and write. A more holistic approach was adopted including an education training program. An employment program is achieving success with 90 placements last year and 75 the year before. He told stories of very difficult cases with which he had been associated. The Centre has a GP, nurse and access to a psychologist; workshops, counselling and support are provided. Amenities include a Day Centre, showers, laundry, lockers, television & reading, games & recreation.

The next exciting development is that Hutt Street has been selected to implement a Cabinet Social Impact Bond (successfully trialed in the UK), drawing from those who have been sleeping rough for at least 3 months. The \$9m program requires Hutt St to keep such vulnerable people out of hospital, out of jail, in decent accommodation and provide pathways for lifestyle improvement. Another program is to establish small enterprises such as coffee dispensing. This year, as economic conditions have worsened, there has been a significant increase (about 75 each month) in people seeking help. Homelessness was previously a male domain but now nearly as many females are appearing, often as a result of domestic violence.

Member Spotlight: Zabit Aimal's mission is to make peace Anne Ford The Rotarian 19 Aug 2016

Kabul, Afghanistan, isn't the easiest place for a fatherless child to grow up. Years of harsh Taliban rule had left Zabit Aimal the sole provider for his mother and sister.

So in 2007, at age 17, he jumped at the chance to work as a translator and cultural adviser for American troops. Aimal was impressed with one American in particular, Nevada National Guard officer Kurt Neddenriep, a member of the Rotary Club of Elko, Nev. "His unit didn't break down doors and make people angry. They'd go to the tribal elders, use me as a mediator to ask what's wrong, sit with them over tea, and listen to their side of the story," he says. "I asked Kurt, 'Why is your unit so warm-hearted?' He explained to me, 'Back home, I'm a Rotarian. I believe in peace."

Aimal learned that Rotarians believe in generosity, too. With Neddenriep's help, as well as donations from the Rotary clubs of Reno, Carson City, and other cities, Aimal graduated from the University of Nevada at Reno in 2014 with a bachelor's degree in political science. Now a Rotary Peace Fellow, he is working on his master's degree in international politics and security studies at the University of Bradford in England.

And after that? "I'd like to be involved in charity organizations that operate in war-torn countries," he says. "Anything that will let me help The Rotary Foundation's mission: to create peace."
