Whilst we are fortunate to have access to Rotary Down Under and The Rotarian magazine, spare a thought for those who are not able to buy magazines, read magazines and therefore keep unto date with information about current issues or even what Rotary does in the world.

Remember, when you receive your magazines, do not dispose of them, recycle them by collecting as many as possible from club members and placing the magazines where people wait, such as dental surgery, doctors surgery, hair dressers, libraries, waiting rooms etc. At least then we will provide an opportunity for a non-Rotarian to read about our programs.

Whilst I am raising the issue of promoting Rotary, may I also remind you to think seriously about supporting the *Salvation Army Red Shield Appeal*. Both DG Eric Russell of District 9500 and myself have spent considerable time with the Salvation Army negotiating a promotional activity for Rotary. What an opportunity to be seen in a Rotary polo shirt collecting for the Salvation Army. Rotary working in partnership with others will bring greater recognition for us as Rotarians.

Rotary International has this month signed a project partner agreement with ShelterBox allowing the two organizations more closely to provide relief and temporary shelter to survive the natural disasters. Rotary International Secretary John Hewko said "the agreement will enable Rotary Club members to have an immediate lifesaving impact on communities hit by natural disasters".

On the subject of natural disasters let us reflect on the hardships that are being endured by communities in *Fiji* because of flooding. The devastation is far worse due to the fact that the water table remains high from the floods in January. Rotary New Zealand has established a "Rotary New Zealand 2012 Fiji Flood appeal" and I have sent \$5,000 from our District Disaster Fund to this appeal. Information as to where clubs can forward donations to this appeal will be provided later.

On the home front, DGE Roy is currently well into his training program having completed the Chair, AG and PETS training. The District Assembly is to be held on Sunday May 20th at Unity College, Murray Bridge. Please consider taking your new

Rotarians to the Assembly as well as your club leaders because a significant amount of Rotary Information is disseminated on that day.

Recently Kathy and I were able to visit the Long Term Youth Exchange students at their weekend at Lameroo. The students no doubt enjoyed the weekend that was capably put together by the Rotary Club of Lameroo to provide an exposure to country life in Australia. The highlight of the day was watching each of the students as they tried



their hand at shearing a sheep. It seems that even District Governor's are not able to avoid the opportunity of shearing.

Several club milestone celebrations occurred recently with the Rotary Club of Coromandel Valley celebrating their 20th Anniversary and the Rotary Club of Mitcham celebrating their 50th Anniversary. The later event was extremely well put together with Trevor Martin being rewarded for 50 years of service and three Paul Harris Fellows being presented and those attending being entertained by Rob Kelvin a former Channel 9 News reader.

The nominating committee for District *Governor for 2014-2015* carried out the interview process on Sunday 1st April and have chosen *AG Jerry Casburn* to succeed DGN Wendy Gaborit. This appointment whilst subject to the usual appeal process should become final and binding on Sunday 15th April when we can congratulate Jerry on his successful nomination.

The 2012 District Conference is in its final stages of preparation. Everything is in place and we urge those Rotarians who have not yet committed to attending the conference to make their decision. District conferences are excellent opportunities to hear more about Rotary, to meet new friends to enjoy the company of other Rotarians, to renew your energies and celebrate the success of your personal and club involvement during the last year.

Foundation Contributions

Club Boards will shortly be making decisions about distributing the funds they have raised this

year. I would like each club to seriously consider donating to the Rotary Foundation each year. It is recommended that each club donate, as a minimum, USD100/member from their service account. The funds are to be donated to the Annual Programs Fund and sent by cheque or electronic transfer to The Rotary Foundation PO Box 1415 Parramatta NSW 2124. Clubs will get one Paul Harris Fellow credit for every USD1000 donated to the Annual Programs Fund. Half of this money is returned to the district and clubs for future Foundation funded projects and the other half is retained by the Foundation to fund Peace fellows, GSE teams and Matching Grants.

In addition I encourage every Rotarian to become a Centurion by donating personally AUD100 each year. These donations should be sent to PDG Malcolm Lindquist c/- RC of Brownhill Creek PO Box 111 Torrens Park SA 5062. Malcolm will provide you with a certificate and pin to mark our donation and then will forward the funds to the Foundation at Parramatta which will in turn forward you a tax receipt. He will send you a reminder each year to renew your contribution. Rotarians can choose to donate this either to the Annual Programs Fund (for which they will get PHF credits too) or to the Polio Eradication Fund.

At this stage we have raised USD44.82 per Rotarian as a district as a whole so we have some considerable way still to go but most of the funds come in the last two months of the year.

Congratulations to the following clubs which have reached or exceeded the USD100/Rotarian already. Broken Hill, Brownhill Creek, Glenelg, Holdfast Bay, Hyde Park, Magill Sunrise, Mobilong, Mt Barker, Red Cliffs, South Mildura and Yankalilla. The following clubs are over half way to their target: Goolwa, Hallett Cove, Irymple, McLaren Vale, Mildura, Noarlunga, Norwood. Tenclubs have so far, not contributed anything to the Foundation.

MALARIA AWARENESS DAY 2012

The WHO determined that 25 April would be World Malaria Day. Australian Rotarians Against Malaria (RAM), decided to recognise 30 April as Malaria Awareness Day with the theme for 2012—

"Sustain Gains, Save Lives: Invest in Malaria".



The malaria map has been shrinking over the past decade. WHO says that investments in malaria control have created unprecedented momentum and yielded remarkable results. In Africa, malaria deaths have been cut by one third during the last decade. Outside Africa, 35 of the 53 affected countries have reduced cases by 50% in the same period. In countries where malaria control has been effectively implemented, infant mortality rates have fallen by approximately 20 per cent. WHO says that maintaining this trend substantially dependent on the resources that will be invested in control efforts.

The main control method used by RAM has been the provision of long lasting, insecticide treated, mosquito nets, through its *Adopt A Village* program. In the Solomons, the annual incidence of confirmed malaria cases has decreased markedly since the RAM intervention from over 700 cases per 1,000 people in parts of the country over a decade ago to 75 cases per 1,000 in 2010 and 46.5 cases per 1,000 in 2011.

WHO says that sustaining malaria control efforts will propel malaria-endemic countries towards the 2015 Millennium Development Goals, especially those relating to improving child survival, maternal health, eradicating extreme poverty and expanding access to education.

Many thanks to those D9520 Clubs, which have already made a contribution to RAM. If your Club has not done so, please consider this worthy cause. I am available to attend Club meetings to speak (either 5 minute spot or as guest speaker) about malaria.


