RC of Mobilong - Homburg Park Project



Homburg Park, a large public space in a depressed socially disadvantaged area has been given a face lift. The Rural City of Murray Bridge (RCMB) as part of its re-imagine community program committed funds to transform a bare space into an area which would meet the needs residents for a child friendly area. With the development of a large children's playground and the adjacent Cycle Speedway facilities the Rotary Club of Mobilong saw the need to extend the park's facilities to include a shelter, complete with electric BBQ and seating.

With the co-operation of RCMB who assisted with the concrete flooring

and the electricity supply, the club set itself to raise funds to supply and erect the shed, BBQ and seating. With funds provided through the Club's major fundraiser – the Mobilong Markets and from monies raised in the Rotary Club's Wishing Well, placed in the local marketplace the project went from conversation to action.

Using a range of skills and lots of effort the shed was erected over one weekend. Once the concrete floor was laid, the team were back to install the BBQ, seats and table.

PP Warren Pratt commented that it would be great to see the local families & children using and enjoying these facilities which would not have been possible without the help from our Club members' various skills & the generosity of the general public which is much appreciated.

The Club gathered at Homburg Park on ...and celebrated the opening of the "pergola" with a sausage sizzle. Mayor and invited guests witnessed the dedication of the facility to Fay Stephen – deceased, wife of Charter president Harry Stephen.
