During the month several of the Management group had the privilege of attending a mini assembly, which was held in Broken Hill with approximately 25 members attending from the two clubs. The day was informative with many aspects of Rotary being discussed. At the dinner on Saturday night PDG Euan Miller presented a Rotary Foundation segment and Ambassadorial Scholar, Shawn Mire was guest speaker.

Our club visits were completed with one final presentation to be made at a Waikerie meeting due to violent weather causing major disruption and damage during the course of our visit. Thankfully a gas BBQ and candles were available to enable some fellowship in what was another setback to the town and club members, having lost all their Rotary regalia and effects just two months previously when a major part of the hotel burnt down.

The 2011 Health of the River System Youth Forum was held in Lake Cullulleraine on 17th to 20th November and Kathy and I were thrilled to be there to see the excitement of the participants when they arrived and settled in to their tasks for the weekend.

The program a co-operative venture between Rotary District 9520 and the Murray Darling Fresh Water Research Centre enables young people from Years 9 and 10 to experience environmental science, management of natural resources and river health issues. Along with the social and economic impact on water usage, the forum provides for strong teamwork focus, which is developed through social and physical activities.

At the end of November DGE Roy, DGN Wendy and myself attended the Rotary Institute in Brisbane, which provides further training for PDG's, DG's, DGE's and DGN's. SHANNONS YANKALILLA CRUISE



The **Rotary Club of Yankalilla** presented its fourth annual SHANNONS Yankalilla Cruise event on Sunday 20 November 2011 at the Yankalilla Memorial Oval and what a day it was for motoring enthusiasts and rock 'n' rollers! An estimated 400 fabulous vehicles were shown on the oval - hotrods, classics and customs - and close to 2000 people in attendance. The Cruise departed from Castle Plaza at 10.00am and by 11:15am they were streaming down the Yankalilla Hill.

The **Silverados**, and veteran of rock 'n' roller **Bobby Hunter and The Rockefellas**, performed for the many people attending. The dance floor was full most of the day, and the dancers a delight to watch. Many of the dancers were from Rock 'n' Roll clubs throughout the state, and they certainly made the most of the fabulous music.

There was food, drink, icecream, coffee, strawberries, popcorn, licorice and more catered for in the many stalls.

The **Rotary Club of Hyde Park** presented 'PIT STOP', a health initiative for men. Participants registered for PIT-STOP and then proceeded through a number of 'stations' that were staffed by health 'mechanics'. A total of 67 men took the PIT STOP challenge and had themselves assessed for 'roadworthiness' by having their 'oil pressure' (blood pressure), 'Chassis Check' (body fat), 'Duco' (sun care), 'Fuel Additives' (alcohol), 'Fuel Impurities' (diabetes), 'Exhaust' (smoking), 'Battery' (physical activity), 'Shock Absorbers' (stress management), 'Spark Plugs' (testicles and prostate cancer) assessed. If participants failed more than two individual stations, they were presented with a 'Work Order' sticker to take to their health professional. If they passed all stations, they were presented with a 'Registration Sticker' declaring that their body is a 'Hot Machine'.



ROTARIANS AGAINST MALARIA **UPDATE** **SOLOMON ISLANDS**

Following the 2010 mass distribution of over 300,000 LLINs in Solomon Islands and an annual IRS campaign in which over 35,000 houses have been sprayed, 2011 has seen some of the greatest gains in reducing the burden of malaria over the past 10 years. In particular, the total number of reported malaria cases has reduced significantly, with just over 13,600 cases of malaria confirmed in the January to June period of 2011. In comparison to previous years, in the same January to June period of 2010 there were just over 20,800 confirmed cases, in 2006 there were 44,124 confirmed cases, and in 2001 there were 44,699.

Schools are being visited across the country promoting awareness of malaria, with over 220 schools visited in 2010 as part of the malaria awareness campaign.

Recently a team from the Rotary Club of Port Augusta completed the construction of a malaria staff house at Tulagi. Two more houses funded under the AusAID program are to be constructed at Seghe and Marau in the first six months of 2012, if you are interested in either, contact either PDG Wayne Morris or PDG Peter Thomas. Due to commitment of the funding of malaria infrastructure for 2012 being for the renovation of the malaria research centre any further housing is likely to be deferred to 2013.

Group Celebrations

The Old Goat and Ambassadorial scholars, Peace Fellows and GSE alumni were features at six Foundation Celebration dinners held by clubs and groups last month. Dinners were hosted at Marion (Gr.8), Broken Hill, Mildura (Gr.1), Loxton (Gr.2), Stirling and Murray Bridge (Gr.3). Around 465 Rotarians and partners attended the events.

The Old Goat was Foundation Chair Euan Miller who regaled the dramas of a matching grant involving some missing breeding goats destined for a village in Nepal (which all ended happily, thank goodness) and who showed ways that both individuals and clubs can not only increase their giving to the Foundation without dipping any further into Rotarians pockets, but also do it each year. Our target this year is to exceed USD100 per member. After a 30% increase in giving by clubs and individuals last year we reached \$96.83/member across the district so we are very close to our target.

The Clubs were then inspired by some of the beneficiaries of Foundation grants who told their personal stories of what the grant had meant to them. Shawn Mire, an Ambassadorial scholar from New Orleans currently studying at Carnegie Mellon University in Adelaide, spoke at both Marion and Broken Hill; Phyllis Chirchiglia, recently returned GSE team member to Denmark, spoke at Mildura; Caroline Bristow, Past President of Renmark, spoke of her GSE experience in Scotland and the impact on her life since, at the Loxton dinner. At the Group 3 dinners, our new Ambassadorial scholar Hannah Watson, who is going to the University of Leiden in the Netherlands, spoke at Stirling and Juliet Kenny, our Peace Fellow going to the University of Uppsala in Sweden, spoke at Murray Bridge.

The Foundation Committee is grateful for the support shown by clubs and especially for the assistance of the AGs and host clubs for making each event such a success.

Group 4 has a Foundation dinner planned for 20 Mar 2012 with Gemma Sisia of St Jude's school as the speaker and Groups 5,6 and 7 are expected to hold Foundation celebration dinners in 2012 as well.

FUTURE VISION PLAN—UPDATE

As November was Foundation month on our calendars, I thought I would try and update on progress with the Future Vision plan and the plans to roll it out to the Rotary world in 2013. There is no doubt the pilot program has drawn a variety of responses both positive and negative. In fairness most of the negatives I have heard relate to change. Change to existing relationships where those relationships are between a pilot and non-pilot district. These have been frustrating. Others have lamented the demise of Group Study Exchange and as an ex team member I understand the emotional tie to that program. I think the Vocational Teams can and should be an exciting development and I also believe if Districts want to keep the more traditional GSE exchange then they can but the funding arrangements are different.

Some interesting statistics are starting to emerge from the pilot. Did you know that pilot districts increased their annual giving by 17% compared to a 10% lift for non-pilots. The Foundation processed 303 grants in the first year of the pilot and the area of Global Grants the areas of focus in most demand were water and sanitation projects (29%) and disease prevention (20%) The four other areas of focus were reasonably equally shared. The amazing statistic for me is that 99 of the 100 pilot districts participated in a Global grant.

So the plan will roll out to all districts in 2013. The six areas of focus will become Rotary's six areas of focus. There will be just one Rotary International strategic plan and that will include activity now being trialled in the pilot. Training will start soon and climax with full training at the International Assembly in January 2013. The software and systems will be ready and non-pilots can start thinking about how they will manage this change anytime now. Exciting times are ahead of us as we have the opportunity to really refocus our service work. In the research conducted in 2009 as part of reviewing the RI Strategic Plan 69% of respondents said they wanted the opportunity to do more service. Here is that opportunity.

AUSTRALIAN ROTARY HEALTH

Supporting young minds

Most people look back on their youth with pleasant memories. For some, however, the teenage years can be a very challenging time of life.



Studies have revealed that within a 12 month period. 7% of Australians aged between 0-17 years and 26% aged between 16-24 years were experiencing mental health problems. Other studies have found that only one quarter of these young people had received professional health care for their illness.

Australian Rotary Health has this year commissioned seven new projects that will be funded in the year 2012, all of which will centre on Australian Rotary Health's new focus, the mental health of young Australians.

The studies vary in focus from an in-depth look at the social costs of young Australians with mental illness and self based self-help intervention for young people experiencing suicidal thoughts, to a look at intervention strategies for young people witnessing a parent undergo cancer treatment.

The studies will also look at known associations between mental ill health and drug and alcohol abuse and new treatment therapies for first episode psychosis patients who subsequently develop post traumatic stress disorder.

Mental illness is the leading cause of disability in young people worldwide. The success of these studies will help relieve the burden placed on young Australians by mental illness.

INSTITUTE FOR WATER EDUCATION**Rotary partners with world's largest post-graduate water education institution**

Rotary clubs will be helping train engineers and scientists to solve problems in water and sanitation, particularly in developing countries, through a new strategic partnership between The Rotary Foundation and UNESCO-IHE Institute for Water Education.

Through the partnership, the Foundation will offer packaged grants that Rotary clubs may use to select and sponsor scholarships for professionals in the water sector. Up to eight students a year may be chosen for any of three master of science programs at the institute in Delft, the Netherlands.

Both the institute and Rotary share a vision of making water and sanitation more accessible and more sustainable for all people, particularly the poor. The partnership directly supports Rotary's water and sanitation area of focus.

"This strategic partnership with UNESCO-IHE enables Rotary to work with a globally recognized leader in the training of water professionals at a time when such experts are desperately needed in many parts of the world," said Rotary Foundation Trustee Chair William B. Boyd.
