

On the 23rd October I had the pleasure of attending the RC Loxton and participating in an event to raise the profile of Rotary in the End Polio game. President Marian Woodberry took up my challenge and invited community members to be present. We donned our red shirts and pinned amongst others the CEO of the Loxton Waikerie Council. On that occasion, I had the pleasure of meeting Lillian a survivor of polio who graciously acceded to my request to tell her story. I invite you to read it further down in this Newsletter.

This week in Canberra along with my DG cohort I attended a breakfast for Polio Australia, this is a not for profit group who works for and with polio survivors in Australia. Did you know, there are some 400,000 Australians living with residual disabilities and post polio debilitating effects. The latter first emerged some 20 years ago with the identification of new, previously unrecognised symptoms which effect people whose conditions were previously thought to be stable. Polio Australia supports this group through the provision of service information

It serves as a reminder to us of the role the Foundation plays in enabling Rotarians to give service and deliver humanitarian programs both here and overseas. Associate Member Pilot - Wakierie's Experience



Towards the end of 2010, Rotary International published calls for submission for clubs to be selected into a pilot program for associate members. There was to be an equitable representation of Rotary Clubs from each of the 34 Rotary zones, with no more than 200 in all.

The members of Waikerie Rotary Club voted to apply for admission to this pilot program in March 2011, and their submission was subsequently accepted.

The purpose of the program is to research various options for Rotary membership and what impact those variations have on the effectiveness of the club.

The 'Shed' - RC of Campbelltown



The RC of Campbelltown's major fund raising activity is the "SHED", which is used for the sale of donated pre-loved goods held on the last Saturday of every month. This enables the Club to raise \$5,000 to \$6,000, which is used to benefit many charities, local and internationally.

Members, partners and volunteers make the "SHED" happen, with a commitment of over 400 plus hours every month. Volunteers assist with sorting and preparing goods for sale, identifying goods of exceptional value to go to the auction house and scrap metal sorting.

Items of clothing and shoes, furniture and whitegoods are also sorted for the delivery to the Hutt Street Centre to be distributed to victims of Domestic Violence.

Lillian's Polio Story



I spent Christmas as a 2 year old in the Adelaide Children's Hospital with Polio.

The hospital resembled an army barracks with beds overflowing into the corridors. When a child died, the best was quickly filled. The mournful sound of the iron lung machines echoed throughout the wards.

I was strapped to the bed hands and feed over the months I was there. During that time, because of the trauma I didn't speak. The nursing staff assumed I was mute. When I left hospital in my mother's arms I cried "I have a home. I have a home." These were my first words since entering the hospital. I thought I was put into that dreadful place because I must have been naughty.

Australian Rotary Health Medal

It is important that opportunities for learning to use this new technology is available for all club members as part of your own training program.

As a minimum the President and Secretary must be able to confidently and regularly update membership numbers including current contact information within the deadlines 1st December and 1st June each Rotary year, and input Incoming Officers before the end of December each year.

The Treasurer should be encouraged to manage all the requirements of the Semi Annual Returns online and on time.

The next step is for all Club Leaders to be able to input program goals, and achievements. All members should be encouraged learn to view the achievement of Club goals, and to ensure their own record profile is correct.
