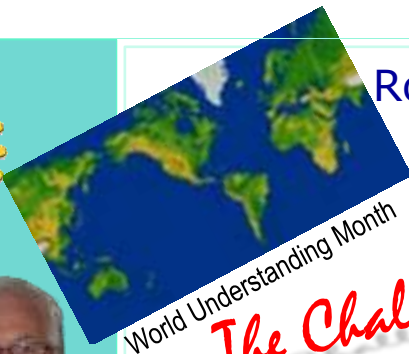

RI President 2013-14

Ron Burton unveiled the RI theme during the opening plenary session of the 2013 International Assembly in San Diego, California, USA, the annual training event for incoming district governors.



"If we really want to take Rotary service forward, then we must make sure that every single Rotarian has the same feeling about Rotary that each one of us here has today," Burton said. "We need to make sure that every Rotarian has a meaningful role to play, that they're all making a contribution, and that their contribution is valued."

Ron Burton emphasized that the job doesn't end when a new member joins: "It's not done until that new member is engaged in Rotary, inspired by Rotary, and uses the power of Rotary service to change lives."

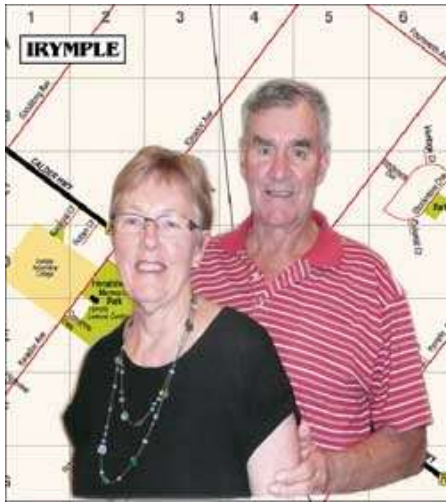
What Paul Harris Said:

Meet: AG Lesley Mitchell

Lesley was born in Red Cliffs and lived all her early life on a dried fruit property at Cardross. She attended the Cardross Primary School, and then the Mildura High School where she completed her Secondary Education and met Neville. Lesley and Neville were married in 1967 and moved to the Mitchell family farm at Wemen. Lesley was fully involved with the farm production which in the early days was wheat sheep and cattle. Lesley particularly enjoyed working with sheep. Today the property is irrigated and produces wine and dried fruit.

Lesley and Neville have three children and 6 grandchildren. As their three children started school Lesley became involved in their education in Robinvale. She held

the position of Parent Liaison Officer at Robinvale Secondary College for 15 years.

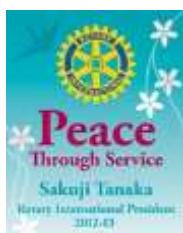

Australia Day Awards

The Awards reward and recognise individuals and organisations that have made a noteworthy contribution during the current year, and/or give an outstanding service over a number of years, to a local community over and above normal employment duties.



Outstanding contribution and community service includes areas such as; education, health, fundraising, charitable and voluntary services, business, sport, arts, the environment, or any other area that contributes to the advancement and well being of a community.

Citizen of the Year Award

To be eligible, the person must be an Australian Citizen, and has to have made a significant contribution during the previous year, or given outstanding service to the Holdfast Bay community over a number of years.

End Polio Now !

An email from Jon Stillman, Zone 28 Coordinator

Dear friends,

This email is to share with you my passion which is to End Polio Now. The attached link below is for an article from the current Time Magazine and gives a good account of the work Rotary International has been doing in an effort to eradicate polio. Part of my role as a Rotary volunteer is to work with 12 Rotary Districts of Zone 28 to help inform the public that polio still exists and to help raise funds to be used in the polio eradication effort. My passion resulted from a trip to Nigeria where I was able to place the Sabin vaccine drops on the tongues of children aged five years and younger and then look in the eyes of parents who brought their children to be vaccinated. Words cannot explain the nonverbal appreciation expressed in the faces of those parents.

Creating awareness that the disease still exists and that there is an on-going effort with Rotary, UNICEF, WHO and the Center for Disease as spear-heading partners to eradicate the disease. The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation joined the effort in 2007 and have been a major player in helping. An end game strategy is being developed and with some luck we will see the end of this devastating disease in the not to distant future.

Part of my role is to create awareness that this disease is an airplane flight away and encourage our citizens to keep their children immunized against polio. My request to you is that you forward the link to this article to everyone on your email list as I am doing. The article is very interesting and while the US version of Time does not have it as the cover feature, the European issue of Time does have it on the cover.

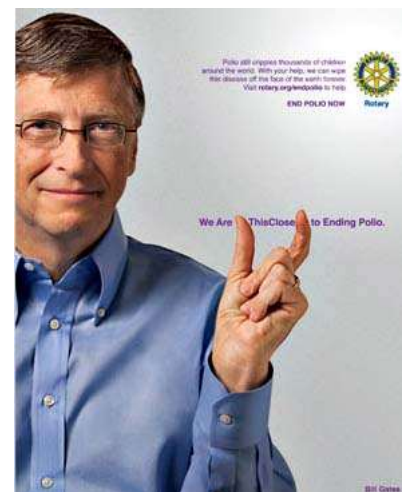

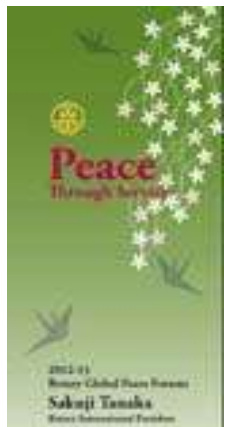

Improving Mental Health through Focussed Research

Statistics show that young people are at the greatest risk of suffering a mental health issue and that the prevalence of mental disorders declines with age. This year Australian Rotary Health has recognised the significance of Mental Health among the younger population by directing its funding into studies which focus on the mental health of young Australians aged up to 25 years old.

Each year in Australia, approximately 2,500 persons die by suicide; it is the most common cause of death in Australians aged 15-44. Suicide is particularly prevalent in young people aged 16-24 years and sadly, many young suicidal people do not receive treatment.

Professor Helen Christensen, Professor of Mental Health at the University of New South Wales, received a Mental Health Research Grant this year to develop and test a self-help intervention website to reduce suicidal thoughts. She has said that without a crucial grant from Australian Rotary Health, her ground-breaking study into suicide prevention would not have eventuated.

"Australian Rotary Health grants are incredibly vital to the development of innovative new health strategies", said Professor Christensen. "In my case, they have provided funds to support the development of a suicide prevention website."

The "Living with Deadly Thoughts" website has been designed to provide an accessible, anonymous and reputable source of information and assistance.

Mental illness is the leading cause of disability in young people worldwide. Australian Rotary Health supports the need to find preventions and cures for mental illnesses by funding Mental Health Research Grants. The success of these studies will help relieve the burden placed on the Australian population and support healthier minds, bodies and communities.

The competition required the student teams to design, develop and market a miniature F1 racing car.

In Abu Dhabi the Brighton students beat 32 teams from 23 countries. For the international win the team received the Bernie Ecclestone Trophy and each of them wins a scholarship to London University to study engineering.
