While I do not know the exact number, an estimated 1300 Rotarians descended upon the Hyatt Grand Manchester, consisting of 1100 District Governors Elect and partners representing the 540 Districts worldwide, plus trainers, Rotary International dignitaries and staff for six days of in-depth training for the role we take up in July of this year.

The training given to Australian Governors is among the best in the world and Briony and I had already been able to experience three key training programmes in our journey to this point. Training at the Assembly rounded off what we had already gained, as well as allowing us to enjoy the fellowship of our classmates from more than 200 countries worldwide....

Rebuilding communities in the Philippines goes on ... and on

On the heel of a horrendous October earthquake, the Philippines was ravaged the following month by Typhoon Haiyan, the "deadliest Philippines Typhoon on record" that killed over 6,000 with bodies still being found.

Disaster Aid has now provided shelter and assisted more than 10,000 families, and is actively engaged in providing vital Home Repair Kits – more than 1,000 so far delivered, AND installed. That is in response to the question we asked at the outset, "please tell us, what do you need most?" The materials for those kits lumber, tools, nails, tarps, galvanised iron and so on are in the main sourced within the area.

Disaster Aid is in the Philippines "for the long haul" to assist local communities rebuild and provide clean water to those on Bohol, Panay and Mindanao.

Read more about Disaster Aid in the Philippines Typhoon Haiyan swept through the Central Philippines on 8
November, killing nearly 6,000 people and displacing some 4 million people, flattening homes and damaging schools, health centers and other infrastructure. Experts estimate the storm was one of the strongest ever to make landfall.

Thus, the Help & Assistance from Rotary, Inc. was born. In order to begin work in earnest, Help & Assistance from Rotary, Inc. was registered as a non-stock, non-profit corporation to receive donations and undertake relief or reconstruction work or other humanitarian assistance on behalf of Rotarians and other donors in areas devastated by natural or man-made calamities. It began to receive donations intended for victims of Typhoon Haiyan/Yolanda and immediately deliberated on projects that are high impact, build positive public image, and sustainable.
