This month is Rotary Foundation month. We have seen the start of The Rotary Foundation (TRF) group meetings, which are designed to take the programs of the Foundation to the members. During last month the District conducted a TRF Grants workshop that imparted greater knowledge of the process to obtaining a Matching Grant and/or a District Simplified Grant.

During November we will see further Group meetings conducted to bring more Rotarians in our District up to date on the Rotary Foundation and it's activities.

Our District is also very active in Group Study Exchange (GSE) with the GSE team from District 2350 Sweden, returning home after spending one month visiting Rotary clubs and undertaking vocational experiences.

We have also received advice that our Peace Scholars; Juliet Kenny has been accepted to study at the University of Uppsala in Sweden and, Sandy Morey was accepted to undertake Peace and Conflict studies in Thailand mid next year.

October 24th was World Polio Day, What did you do on that day? Many of the Rotarians would have taken advantage of the double Foundation points scheme which applied during the week 24th -29th October for contributions made to the Foundation.

Kathy and I continued with our club visits spending time in the eastern part of our District. As expected the projects and programs were extensive and interesting. Our biggest problem is membership or more specifically the declining number of members in our District and it is gratifying to see the clubs addressing this problem with enthusiasm.

At our District Management meeting held in Calperum Station, the team was able to share time away from the pressures of business and good fellowship resulted in renewed and revitalized approach to our roles.

For those who have not yet visited Calperum Station it is a hidden gem for Rotary. There are many programs that can be undertaken such as tree monitoring, salinity readings, feral animal control, surveying the population of endangered bird species and the like.

Rotary House has benefited from new carpet and a major kitchen refit with donations from the Blackwood and Mitcham clubs. The District is seeking interest from committed Rotarians to form a group of no more than four to oversee the activities at Calperum. It is also envisaged that a member in each club will be allocated to help coordinate programs by the clubs in the future. For those who seek further information please contact Bob Arnold whose details appear in the District Directory.

Another issue discussed at Calperum was the matter of Risk Management. Clubs need to review their procedures and Risk Management policies to ensure that they are up to date with the legal requirements and provide adequate protection for Rotarians and friends of Rotary actively involved in club projects.

As we move towards the festive season it is important that our procedures and equipment are thoroughly tested and that we do not cut corners in our Risk Management to place anyone at risk.

The District has just completed two Rotary Leadership Institute training sessions that were well attended. Interest in the program has increased to such an extent that the next course, which is due to commence in April has already had many expressions of interest from enthusiastic Rotarians. SHELTER BOX



ShelterBox is already on site in Turkey – as you can see from the following URL (http://www.shelterbox.org/ news.php?id=863)

Following the massive earthquake that struck southeast Turkey on 23 October, a ShelterBox team is on the ground in the affected area to offer assistance to families in need. ShelterBox Response Team (SRT) members David Eby (US) and Mark Pearson (UK) arrived in Van, a city close to the epicenter of the earthquake, this morning, 26

October. The SRTs are working closely with Turkish Red Crescent - who have requested ShelterBox provide 5,000 boxes! The Turkish Government has now officially requested international assistance and the team is holding discussions with the authorities and other partner to establish how to get urgently required emergency shelter to those in need.

SHELTER BOX (CONTINUED)

David reported: "The weather forecast predicts snow in the next few days, so it is essential that appropriate emergency shelter is provided as soon as possible. Families left homeless will suffer in the sub-zero temperatures unless they are provided with warmth and protection." ShelterBox tents are designed to withstand extreme temperatures, high winds and heavy rainfall. A purposely designed thermal layer can be added between the inner and outer sheets for extra insulation in extreme conditions. ShelterBox can also provide stoves, groundsheets, blankets and warm clothing for people in need.

Globally: - Clearly we are responding on a global scale – with a new disaster every two weeks worldwide. So far 2011 has seen ShelterBox involved in 20 disasters - typically >30,000 boxes per annum are distributed but it is essential to have stock ready for immediate deployment – particularly in crises such as Turkey with sub zero night time temps and snow & winter onset just beginning.

ShelterBox teams are also currently assisting in **Thailand** (500 boxes already distributed), **Ethiopia, Kenya** (10,000 tents with UNHCR), **Philippines** and Response Teams are assessing need for aid in **Central America** where Hurricane Jova and torrential rains have caused landslides and flooding, leaving hundreds of thousands affected. This year Australian SRTs have deployed to Ethiopia, Kenya, Madagascar, Thailand, Haiti, Japan and Bolivia to name a few. We are now one of the foremost sources of hope in times of disaster.

ROTARY OCEANIA MEDICAL AID FOR CHILDREN

WHAT IS ROMAC?

ROMAC is now in its 20th year of operations. Rotarians volunteer their time and expertise to run this Rotary program that



encompasses all the Districts of Australia and New Zealand. ROMAC is assisted by many eminent Australian surgeons who generously respond to requests for assistance, this humanitarian program has provided over 300 children from 20 countries with urgent medical treatment that has given them new hope. To date, children have been brought from Fiji, Papua New Guinea, Malaysia, Indonesia, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Vietnam, Cambodia, Russia, China, Tonga, Solomon Islands, The Philippines, Pakistan, Iran, Timor-Leste, Vanuatu, Kiribati, Nauru and Zimbabwe.

The children usually come from very remote areas and are brought to Australia, as medical treatment is simply not available in their home countries. These are children with herniated brains, deformed limbs, horrific burns, heart conditions and in the case of the Bosun (Siamese) twins, separation as they were joined face to face from the lower chest to the umbilicus.

Today our District along with District 9500 is actively involved with one child returning home after treatment and another arriving to receive treatment.

He holds a number of qualifications including MA Terrorism, Safety and Security, Bachelor of Education and Bachelor of Social Sciences. Sandy will take up his place in June 2012. Sandy is being mentored by Hyde Park.

Juliet Kenny, who was awarded a Peace Fellowship in 2010, was due to take up her studies at the Universidad del Salvador, Buenos Aires, in February 2012; has had to change universities because the Foundation Trustees withdrew accreditation of that university for the peace and conflict studies program. She will now take up a place at the University of Uppsala, Sweden in August 2012. Juliet is being mentored by Norwood.



Hannah Watson, our Ambassadorial Scholar, will go to the University of Leiden in the Netherlands to under-take a Masters program in international law. She commences in August 2012. Hannah is being mentored Brownhill Creek.

Rotarians will have an opportunity to hear one of these Scholars speak at the various Foundation Celebration dinners being held this year. The first dinner was for Group 8 at which 100 Rotarians and partners attended to hear Shawn Mire, an Ambassadorial scholar from New Orleans. AUSTRALIAN ROTARY HEALTH

How can you help improve Indigenous health?

Even in an age where a person can receive basic medical treatment over the

phone, Australia's Indigenous population remain the sub group of Australians with the highest number of health problems.

Members of the Indigenous population are nearly twice as likely to develop heart disease or die from a lifestyle related cancer. Diabetes is 3.5 times more common in Indigenous communities and those over the age of 18 are twice as likely to develop psychological distress than someone of non-Indigenous descent.

Almost a quarter of Australia's Indigenous population live in remote Australia, where access to medical services and facilities is limited. Further complicating matters is the fact that Indigenous Australians are known to seek out treatments from other members of the Indigenous community with whom they feel a spiritual understanding.

Health Indigenous Scholarship program is a collaborative project between Australian Rotary Health, participating Rotary Clubs, the State Governments of South Australia, New South Wales and Victoria and the Australian Government. Since 2002, Indigenous Health Scholarships have been available to Indigenous encourage students to undertake training as a health professional in areas including medicine, nursing, social work, physiotherapy, psychology and
