Key messages, from Kalylan to assist Club to focus on Vocational Service.

- Focus more attention on business networking with integrity as a means of attracting and mentoring the new generation.
- Emphasize the connection between the Four Way Test and the Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses and Professions and their importance to the values of Rotary.
- Work with New Generations at promoting ethics and integrity.

FUTURE VISION PILOT - FIRST YEAR

A project supported by a Rotary Foundation Global Grant is giving children in Yirimadjo, Mali, hope for a malaria-free future.

One hundred Rotary districts and their member clubs set a brisk pace in the first year of the Future Vision pilot, recording many milestones along the way.

The Rotary Foundation awarded 208 global grants, totaling almost US\$12 million, in 2010-11. These grants supported large-scale, sustainable activities aligned with Rotary"s areas of focus in 46 countries.

The first global grant project, completed in July, proved highly effective in preventing the spread of dengue fever in a community in Surakarta, Central Java, Indonesia. Other global grant efforts helped provide thousands of people in Sierra Leone with access to clean water, boosted malaria prevention and treatment in Mali, improved sanitation in India, and expanded literacy in Kenya, to name a few. The grants also funded vocational training teams and equipped scholars to work in sustainable development, health care, peace and conflict resolution, and other fields related to the areas of focus.

AUSTRALIAN ROTARY HEALTH

Supporting a rural doctor or nurse

Many of us know the irritation of waiting to be seen at our GP's office. The frustration at wasting a few



minutes flicking through old magazines often outweighs the appreciation of knowing that there will be a doctor available to us when our name is called. But for the 37% of Australians who live in a non-metropolitan area, 'popping in to see a doctor' is not always an option.

A low number of rural doctors and nurses, poor funding and the vast geographical size of rural hospital and clinic catchments places an increasing amount of pressure on health care services and workers in rural and remote settings.

Australian Rotary Health is actively supporting rural health care by providing scholarships to student doctors and nurses who agree to attend a placement in a rural or remote community. This scholarship allows the recipient to see what a rural community has to offer both personally and professionally and encourages them to consider a medical career in rural Australia upon graduation.

Not only do rural placements help foster ties between medical and nursing students with rural communities, they also allow students to see and experience a range of clinical problems that would not commonly present in metropolitan communities, all while being exposed to a new and adaptive learning environment.

Now with the help of sponsoring Rotary Clubs, Australian Rotary Health has sponsored 76 rural doctors since 2009 and 15 rural nurses since 2007. Your club's sponsorship could increase the amount of medical care available to your fellow Australian.

RC OF MURRAY BRIDGE—"STEPUP" PROGRAM

The Rotary club of Murray Bridge was a major contributor in this new Event held in Murray Bridge and the first time it has been held in South Australia. Four Murray Bridge Rotarians were involved in the Core Creation Team which planned and staged the Event on a weekly meeting basis for four months. Twenty seven Murray Bridge Rotarians were involved in the three days of the Event. The Event brought the Regional Community including the Murraylands, Riverland, and Adelaide Hills together with the message for teenagers "If it's possible for you, it's possible for me, it's just a matter of how!" 250 teenagers participated, organised by DECS with 50 Coaches who paid or were supported by sponsors to be trained and act as facilitators. The teens were divided into groups(pods) of 6, each with a coach and were taken through a series of activities with motivational speakers of very high quality. The StepUP Foundation has some very similar goals to the Murray Bridge Rotary Club's Rotary Assisting Local Youth program (RALY). The speakers were Adam Thompson (a Rock Star with the band "Chocolate Starfish") as Head Coach and Speaker, Rowena McEvoy, Cynthia Morton, the Hon Kelly Vincent MLC, Paralympian Katrina Webb, Blue Earth, and Derrick McManus. Sponsors were critical, Wow! Prizes were used as incentives, and the feedback has been excellent. The Event was costly to



put on in terms of both finance and time but reached such a large number of teenagers its cost effectiveness was justified. See Rotary MB Facebook Website and Google -
