With just half of the clubs visited, Kathy & I feel humble as we move around the District and witness the enthusiasm and keenness shown by of all of the clubs and Rotarians that we have visited. From Broken Hill to Victor Harbor the message is clear, let us reach within to embrace our communities, let us reach within to help those in need.

September is **New Generations month**, and we need to focus our attention on our young people and our youth projects that make a difference in the world.

During the last month we have chosen 20 excellent candidates for the *National Youth Science Forum to* be held in Canberra and Perth in January next year. The orientation day for these students will be held later this month.

The briefing of the **Long Term Exchange Students** took place at Nunyara last weekend when 7 outgoing students were briefed on the Youth Exchange program.

There are currently 15 students in New Zealand on Short Term Youth Exchange, with 19 students from New Zealand having just returned home after spending three months here in District 9520.

Kathy and I were fortunate to attend the *Group Study Exchange (GSE)* farewell of the team to District 1440 led by Marion Lesnicki of the Rotary Club of Onkaparinga, held in the Lobethal Community Sports Centre on Wednesday August 17th. I am sure that the team will represent our District and Rotary with excellence and we wish them a safe journey.

I also attended the return presentation of the *GSE team* that went to District 2350 in Sweden, on Saturday 20th August hosted by the Rotary Club of Norwood. The enthusiasm of each of the team members was clearly evident in their presentations as they presented their cultural and vocational experience gained whilst in Sweden.

I urge every club to consider inviting one of the team members to talk to their members about the virtues and experiences of GSE and see how it impacts on the lives of these young professionals.

August also saw the arrival of the boats circumnavigating Australia raising funds for Polio. *The Yellow Boat Road* was warmly welcomed in Adelaide and we hosted the

crew for their layover. It was perhaps unfortunate that their arrival time was not fixed as the uncertainty of the weather had some effect on the number of Rotarians present to welcome the boats.

The most recent information on funds raised by The Yellow Boat Road is \$159,339 of which 92% will be directed to the End Polio program. What a fantastic effort!



Kathy and I attended the *Tailem Bend Musical "You're the Voice"*. What a incredible experience. To see the many talented Tailem Bend residents performing was certainly entertaining. The Rotary Club of Tailem Bend are to be commended for their enthusiasm in presenting 30 years of the Musical to the Tailem Bend and surrounding communities. We had the pleasure of attending the Charter of the District's second Rotoract Club (joining the Rotoract Club of Mount Barker). What a night! Rotaractor Kate Flack was inducted as the Charter President of the Rotaract Club of Flinders. Past District Governor Malcolm Lindquist made the evening a special and memorable event by presenting the club with its Charter. Our next challenge for District 9520 is to complete the formation of further Rotaract clubs in the District to promote this important entry and window to Rotary in our District for our younger generation.

In closing, as we celebrate **New Generations Month** I draw your attention to the Youth Programs which are set out in our Directory along with the contact details. Make full use of these committees to refresh your knowledge of the programs and how to become involved.

RYLA SEMINAR

What better way could there be for the RYLA Committee to celebrate New Generations month than to hold a RYLA Seminar, which is what we will be doing in the last week of September.

RYLA was born in Queensland in 1959 from a seminar run by the Queensland State Government for young people. It was called 'Gundoo' and was a celebration of youth as part of a festival to mark Princess Alexandra's visit to Australia. The Queensland government invited two young people from every council in Queensland to attend the seminar at no cost to them. The Government funded Gundoo but approached the Rotary Club of Brisbane to accommodate guests, plan the program and run the week. It was a great success with close to 300 young people attending.

Over the course of the following decade the Rotary Club of Brisbane took on Gundoo as a regular project for their club with anything from 20 to 100 participants each year. They re-named it "RYLA" and it spread throughout Australia and across the Tasman to New Zealand. It was finally adopted by Rotary International as an International Rotary Project in 1972. Once adopted, Gundoo was given its official Rotary name - The Rotary Youth Leadership Awards. Previously each district and sometimes each club had named the event as they saw fit.

Today there are approximately 300 known RYLA programs throughout the world in countries as diverse as Australia, Brazil, Cote D'Ivoire, Jordan, Hong Kong, India, Nigeria, Romania, and Slovakia.

This year's 9520 Seminar is being hosted by two clubs, Campbelltown and Onkaparinga, with major input from Damian Leach (Administrator), Margaret Northcote (Registrar) and Ellen Griffiths (Lead Director). They have arranged a program covering topics such as Leadership, Conflict Resolution, Ethics and Public Speaking, which will be delivered by an impressive list of speakers.

Keynote Speaker will be Tori Anderson (pictured) who is a Rotary World Peace Fellow at Chulalongkorn University in Thailand. Tori has worked for almost a decade on issues relating to child rights and youth



and women's empowerment, primarily in countries such as Pakistan, India and Afghanistan. She is also in the process of completing a documentary dealing with child trafficking across the Thai-Burmese border.

A further report on the Seminar and Tori's address will be published in the November Newsletter.

YOUTH EXCHANGE

Youth Exchange has two formats, the Long Term exchange where Australian students go to an overseas country for 12 months and we, in exchange, host a student from that overseas country, and the Short Term exchange for three months that runs with New Zealand.

Our District has just completed hosting 19 students from NZ, and now 15 Australians have flown to NZ. Whilst in Australia the NZ students enjoy a District organized tour including Sovereign Hill Ballarat, abseiling and rock climbing in the Grampians, and caving at Narracorte. They also visited the Rotary Club of Stawell in District 9780.

Long Term exchange has students from Italy, Spain, USA, Brazil, Belgium, Germany and Austria in Australia. They are sponsored by a club and hosted by four families associated with that club. The hosts do an excellent job, introducing the students into Australian life, and helping them improve their English. There are several District combined functions during their stay, including a notable weekend with the Lameroo club where the students experience sheep mustering and shearing. Pictured is a group of students enjoying a houseboat weekend courtesy of the Renmark club. They also enjoy a three week safari up the East Coast and through the Centre.

We currently have Australian students in Finland, Austria, Sweden and Belgium, plus many others.

Many of us are privileged to welcome the students at their arrival or departure and see the great benefits they gain from the exchange at the end of the 12 months.

NATIONAL YOUTH SCIENCE FORUM



Now in Canberra and Perth, the National Youth Science Forum is the only program in Australia that offers students currently in Year 11 the chance to test-drive a wide range

of universities and careers in the sciences. Selection for the NYSF is very competitive. In any one year as many as 2,000 students may compete for 432 places. In District 9520, 70 students applied for 21 positions this year.

Selection is coordinated by Rotary International with places being allocated by selection committees in each District. The committees are made up of local Rotarians, members of the scientific community including teachers, and past NYSF students. The precise method of selection varies from committee to committee but typically it includes personal interviews and other assessments. It's worth noting that school marks alone will not guarantee success.

To reach one of these "district selections" an applicant must be nominated by a Rotary Club in the district. Clubs may nominate as many students as they wish but as a rule they pick only the best applicant(s).

In April each year students are asked to firstly fill out the online application form on the NYSF website, then take the completed form to a local Rotary Club along with the other supporting documentation that's requested.

Only one Club can be listed online as the sponsor Club, however the occasional student may send their application to one or more other Clubs.

Eligible students are in Year 11, a permanent resident of Australia, and are considering tertiary studies in science, engineering or related areas at an Australian University.

The cost for a student to attend the NYSF in January 2012 is \$2,310. This covers all travel, accommodation and meals while at the Forum. This amount is subsidised by Industry and University partners of the NYSF.

While Rotary Clubs are not required to assist their nominated students financially, it is common for Clubs in District 9520 to offer 50% of the cost of the program. Clubs may also help students with other fundraising activities.

The program is designed specifically for those bright young Australians who will be tomorrow's leaders in the sciences. NYSF will open student's eyes to some extraordinary possibilities.

ROTARACT

Friday August 12th saw District 9520 welcome the chartering of the Flinders Rotaract Club, increasing the number of clubs in the District by 100%, the other club being Mount Barker Rotaract club. The initiative of the Group 5 clubs, Blackwood, Coromandel Valley, Flagstaff Hill, Hallett Cove, Noarlunga and Noarlunga East, the club was started as part of Flinders University and draws its membership from the student body.

The project started in the last quarter of 2010 with much support from the University, in particular Kathryn Anderson, a manager in the Southern Knowledge Transfer Partnership Office. The University facilitated contact with both incoming international and domestic students and Group 5 developed a project team with representation from each club. A small team of willing conscripts formed the nucleus of the new club who promoted it through the open days held at the start of the first semester. 99 students expressed interest and two interest meetings were held. attended by Australian Rotaract President Alana Wilson. This led to some 40+ students signing up to join the club and first meetings were held in April 2011.

Kate Flack, a past Youth Exchange student and one of the initial team. took on and was elected to the position of President, a club executive was formed and the club are now actively working on projects supporting the local and international community. They meet twice monthly, once for a formal meeting and once for a social meeting, each formal meeting is supported by the attendance of a Rotarian from one of the sponsoring clubs.

Rotaract was a once thriving community in this and other Districts and could once again be brought to life providing a feed for increased knowledge of Rotary, as well as potential members. If any clubs are interested in sponsoring future clubs they should contact Jerry Casburn (eMail jerry@thecasburns.com.au).

The Rotary clubs of Campbelltown, Magill Sunrise and Morialta, assisted by PDG Euan Miller are undertaking a similar exercise with Uni SA at the Magill campus and we hope to hear soon of the formation of another new club.

AUSTRALIAN ROTARY HEALTH

Would you know what to do a mental health crisis?

In 2008, a total of 2,191 Australians committed suicide. Over three-quarters of them were male and 103 were Indigenous Australians.



While suicide accounts for only a relatively small proportion (around 1.5%) of all deaths in Australia, its impact on specific age groups is great. According to ABS statistics, in 2008 24% of all male deaths aged 15-24 were due to suicide and more men aged over 85 years die as a result of suicide than any other age

Females did not fare much better, with the median age at death for females who died from suicide just 43.5 years and suicide rates for women aged over 60 remaining consistently high.

Betty Kitchener and Professor Tony Jorm began running Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) courses as a community service activity. MHFA acts as the first line of intervention in much the same way as medical first aid, teaching participants ways of assisting someone in a mental health related crisis before professional assistance becomes available.

Now, Australian Rotary Health, in conjunction with Rotary Clubs around Australia, are running their own preventative mental health first aid workshops that aim to assist in providing support to community members who are at risk of or who are experiencing a mental health crisis.
