GUEST SPEAKER: Tony Henshaw, Australia
Tony Henshaw was born in Vietnam and arrived in Australia as a refugee at the age of seven. Born this year the 50th anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War, Tony is no stranger to conflict and its devastating aftermath. The war instilled a passion for peace and international development, and a commitment to work towards a world free of poverty and conflict.
With over ten years' experience in the development sector, Tony's special interest areas are peace education and post-conflict reconstruction. In 2001, he returned to Vietnam for the first time, as an Australian Youth Ambassador, to work for UNESCO on a peace education project. In 2002, he was awarded the prestigious Rotary World Peace Fellowship to study at the University of North Carolina in the USA. After graduating with a Masters in Education, he was employed by the World Bank to develop a framework for two local ethnic groups in conflict.
More recently, this has led to the Australian Government in Canberra as the Australian Agency for International Development (AusAID) where he manages the aid program in Afghanistan.
Tony and his husband have recently adopted a son in the Buenos Aires, where they now work as a consultant in business training after now doing 15 years and 4000 hours.
Tony will be sharing the story of his family's struggles in post-war Vietnam, his life as a refugee growing up in Australia and how the experience has inspired a career in peace and international development.

Unley Thrift Shop



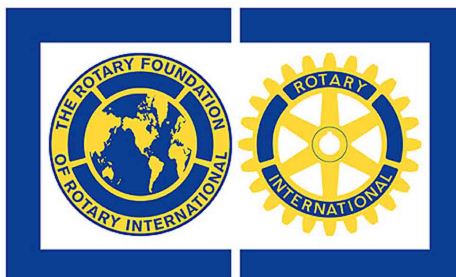
The Rotary Club of Unley operates a Thrift Shop at 130 Unley Road Unley.

New year and new goals

Grant terms and conditions updated

Recently, the eligibility guidelines for district grants were expanded. District grants can now fund youth programs (including Youth Exchange, RYLA, Rotaract, and Interact), construction (including low-cost shelters), travel for staff of cooperating organizations, scholar orientation seminars, grant management seminars, and activities primarily implemented by an organization other than Rotary.

Specialist Training

District Insurance Officer John Rix, and District Risk Management Officer Nigel Woolmer will conduct a free session dealing with club obligations in relation to insurance and the risk management processes.

As part of this session there will also be an overview of club requirements for Youth Protection.

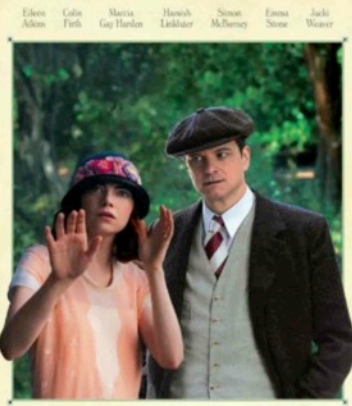

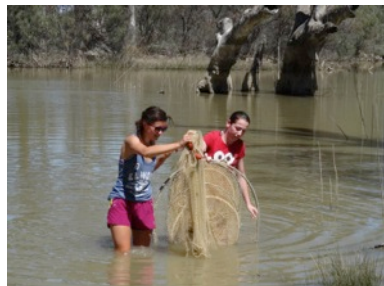
Health of the River Forum - Correction
