Ebola Virus Threatens Bo Hospital

DONATIONS ARE UGENTLY SOUGHT TO FINANCE AN ISOLATION WARD



Rotary Australia World Community Service Ltd has a registered project in Bo, Sierra Leone (No. 46/2007-07 sponsored by the Rotary Club of Turramurra) whose aim is to build and extend the Bo Children's Hospital and to provide hygiene and basic health care and education. The hospital now has a need of the highest order to provide an isolation ward. A quarantine ward has been on the project list for some time but now it is not an overstatement to say it is a matter of life and death. They need to raise \$40,000

As we are all aware the Ebola virus is highly contagious between humans and has no known cure. The latest information available from Sierra Leone Government Ministry of Health (as at August 29th, 2014) is that the country has recorded 1033 cases with 383 deaths (including 140 health workers), and additional suspected cases.

In the nearby town of Kenema which is only one hours drive from Bo, there has been 173 reported deaths and an additional 64 cases in isolation, and now sadly, Bo which has been free of any cases to date, has now incurred six deaths.


A Taste of Timor - Magill Sunrise Rotary

A 'Taste of Timor' is a major fundraising event for the Magill Sunrise Rotary Club's 'Challenge of Oecusse' project, which supports the eradication of leprosy in Timor-Leste. Proceeds will be used to aid the identification of new leprosy cases and establish multi-drug therapy for its cure. Money raised will also be used to identify people in Timor-Leste with disabilities from any cause and to establish effective rehabilitation assistance programs.

Leprosy is a disease associated with extreme poverty, overcrowding and poor sanitation. It can be cured with multi-drug therapy, which is provided by the World Health Organisation.

Since the District of Oecusse is rugged and remote, the challenge is to identify leprosy cases early so that nerve damage, often resulting in permanent disability to hands, feet and eyes, does not occur.

'Taste of Timor' is being held on Saturday, October 25th at the Campbelltown Function Centre. Those attending will gain insight into the culture, history, music and cuisine of Timor-Leste, and learn about the leprosy eradication program, which our Rotary Club supports.

The Probus Chairman plays an extremely important liaison role between Rotary and Probus and is recognised as vital in ensuring the stability and growth of the Probus organisation.

With your Rotary and perhaps Probus experience this is a job for you; you can also appoint your own committee of Rotary/Probus helpers across the district to address the geographical challenges of District 9520.

The Chairman's role is to investigate the need for new Probus clubs, to engage Rotary clubs in sponsoring the formation of new Probus clubs and to ensure the health, future and wellbeing of existing Probus clubs.

The following are goals and opportunities for Rotary District Probus Chairman:



- Investigate the need to establish new Probus clubs in the community
- Organise Probus Information Days annually
- Follow up on non attending clubs to Probus Information Days
- Create a committee and a succession plan
- Promote awareness of Probus in the community radio, newspaper, marketing resources
- Promote the official Probus magazine and other resources to Probus clubs
- Encourage linkages between Probus and Rotary

through family and community networks; volunteering youth programs

- Regularly visit and communicate with Probus clubs in the District
 - o Monitor club health and assist when required
 - o Review statistical information on club membership levels and waiting lists
 - Support clubs in membership development and retention
 - o Present options to save clubs closure; amalgamation or rebirthing
 - Run Probus Information Days; explain value of attendance; follow up non attending clubs
 - o Take every opportunity to present anniversary certificates and attend special functions
 - o Promote Rotary projects to Probus clubs, building and strengthening relationships between the two organisations. Identify sponsoring Rotary clubs.
- Action any 'concerns' when clubs are having difficulties
- Create a regular Probus District Newsletter to communicate with clubs (template provided)
