- Hold a classification talk at a club meeting, talk about your job and learn about the vocations of others. Useful for networking and introducing guests and prospective members
- Organise tours of members' workplaces
- Assist young people in their career decisions. Hold a Careers Expo. Sponsor Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, the Science Experience, National Youth Science Forum and Young Achievers Australia
- Guide and encourage others in their professional development – organise Pride of Workmanship and Pride in Business Awards
- Practice your own profession ethically and with integrity
- Join or form a Rotary Fellowship related to your vocation
- Volunteer for a service project that uses your vocational skills

Council On Legislation

Every three years, Rotarians meet at the Council on Legislation to review and vote on proposed legislation. The Council gives us a voice in how our organisation is governed.



2016 Council on Legislation

The next Council convenes in April 2016.

Legislation must be received at Rotary International headquarters by December 31st 2014. There are no exceptions to this deadline. Club legislation must be endorsed by the District.

What the Council Does

Each Rotary district sends a representative to the Council. Our District's representative is PDG

Peter Ochota. Representatives deliberate and act upon all proposed enactments and resolutions. Enactments seek to change Rotary's constitutional documents, and resolutions express an opinion or make a recommendation to the RI Board.

The Rotary International Board reviews and acts on resolutions adopted by the Council and items referred to the Board.

Proposing Legislation

Clubs need to submit proposed resolutions as soon as possible to meet the December 2014 deadline. Information to assist in preparation of submissions is available on the Rotary International website at <http://www.rotary.org/col>

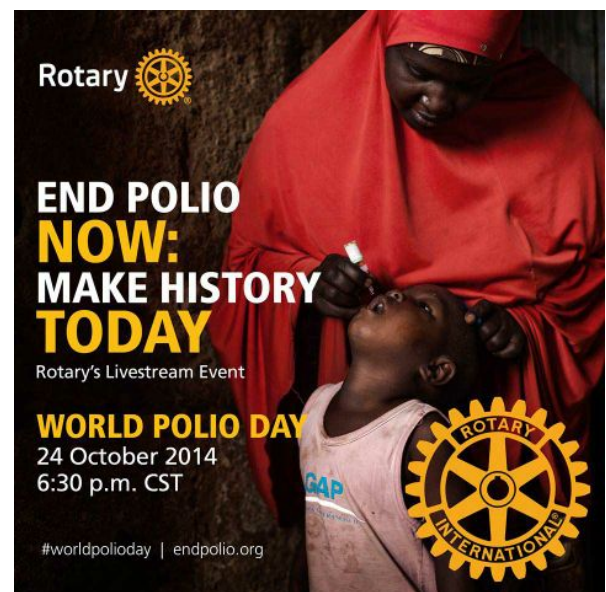
World Polio Day

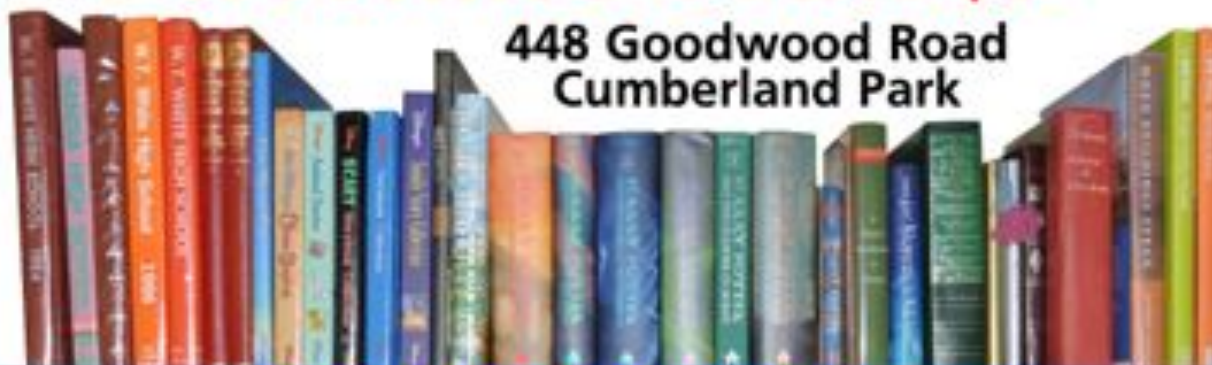
