- Offensive or suggestive language
- Personal attacks
- Anonymous postings
- Widely off-topic comments
- Spam or advertisements
- Offensive visual materials

We reserve the right to delete comments that fall into any of these categories.


World Polio Day

October is Vocational Service Month



Vocational Service is the way Rotary fosters and supports the application of the Ideal of Service to the pursuit of all vocations.

Vocational Service is the shared responsibility of both each Rotary Club and its members. The role of the Club is to implement and encourage the Object by its own actions in dealing with the community and by the development of projects that enable members to use their vocational talents in the service of the community.

The role of members is to conduct themselves and their businesses in accordance with Rotary principles, as embodied in 'The 4 Way Test', to observe and live by The Rotary Code of Conduct and to support the Vocational Service projects that the club has developed.

Promoting integrity through ethical behaviour is an essential part of what it means to be a Rotarian. Two standards developed by Rotarians — The Four-Way Test and the Rotary Code of Conduct — provide a road map for ethical behaviour in the workplace and other areas of life.

The Four-Way Test

The Four-Way Test was conceived in 1932 by businessman Herbert J. Taylor, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago, who served as Rotary International President in 1954-55.

Having taken on the task of saving a company from bankruptcy, Taylor developed the test as an ethical guide to follow in all business matters. The company's survival was credited to this simple philosophy.

Adopted by Rotary International in 1934, The Four-Way Test remains an essential standard against which Rotarians measure ethical behaviour. It has been translated into dozens of languages and promoted by Rotarians worldwide.

The 4-Way Test

Of the things we think, say or do

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build **GOODWILL & BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?**
- 4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?

Rotary Code of Conduct

As a Rotarian, I will

- Exemplify the core value of integrity in all behaviours and activities
- Use my vocational experience and talents to serve Rotary
- Conduct all of my personal, business and professional affairs ethically, encouraging and fostering high ethical standards as an example to others
- ❖ Be fair in all dealings with others and treat them with the respect due to them as fellow human beings
- Promote recognition and respect for all occupations, which are useful for society
- ❖ Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, to improve the quality of life in my community
- Honour the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring disfavor or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians

LT GENERAL DAVID MORRISON AO CHIEF OF ARMY, AUSTRALIA

Lt General Morrison held a variety of regimental positions before being appointed as Australia's Chief of Army in 2011.

He is well-known for his three minute speech on the YouTube hit last year, viewed by one and a half million people, wherein he gave his soldiers a directive to leave the forces if they did not accept that women had to be respected and treated as equals, saying "if that does not suit you, then get out!"

Exactly a year later he shared the stage in London with British Foreign Secretary, William Hague and Angelina Jolie, UN Special Envoy at the Global Summit to end Sexual Violence in Conflict. His was a very powerful message, labelling gender inequality in militaries a "global disgrace" saying "...every soldier has a simple, terrible choice: to be a protector or a perpetrator - there is no other choice, either in cases of a soldier witnessing a rape by another soldier, or by civilians in war zones. I have deliberately excluded a third choice, to be a bystander while others commit sexual violence. There are no bystanders - the standard you walk past is the standard you accept."




