Polio End Game Well And Truly On



The pressure is mounting as we enter those critical final years of our struggle to rid the world of polio. We talk about 'this close' and we talk about Bill Gates and we talk about the world's largest commercial but it all comes to nothing if we don't roll up our sleeves, bend our backs and get the job done. And in the final analysis, nothing will happen if we don't come up with the money because the money is needed to make it happen.

Remember - all funds raised for polio will be matched two-for-one by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation (up to \$35 million a year for 5 years) so we have the chance to pick up an additional \$350 million if we want to make the effort.

Pakistan still remains a problem and is attracting a great deal of attention from health organisations and the Pakistani Government. They have 206 cases so far this year compared to 43 over the same period last year so the situation has to be classed as serious. On the other side of the ledger Nigeria's last reported case was in July this year and Somalia is almost clear. So far this year, the cases in endemic countries total 243 plus 19 from outbreak countries and this is a reversal of the position last year. At this time last year we had more cases in outbreak countries but now it's the other way around.

Remember that a job half done is not a job done. We need clubs and Rotarians to continue the magnificent support they have given over the last 30 years and rise to this one final challenge. End Polio Now.

Youth Exchange Subsidy

Up to \$2,500 Subsidy to Clubs for Youth Exchange



Clubs can apply for subsidies of up to \$2,500 from the District Youth Exchange Committee for hosting an inbound long-term exchange student and sponsoring an outbound for the same year.

Should your club want to sponsor an outbound student only, the club levy of \$300 will be waived for this coming year.

This is a temporary measure for the next applications and the offer will expire on June 30th 2015.

Many clubs have formerly had a long and proud history of supporting youth exchange but the support for this program has recently waned.

Your District Committee is trying to find various ways of encouraging clubs back to youth programs and in particular youth exchange.

This financial incentive is just one of the ways that the District Committee can assist clubs, we will also assist with training, councillor support, hosting arrangements, forms and compliance.

Please talk to your clubs and consider revisiting Long term Youth Exchange and invest in future Rotarians.

International Project - Funding Required

Is your club looking to participate in an International (Global) project for 2015 - 2016?

Why not consider the possibility of combining with other clubs in D9520 and contribute to the establishment of a Women's and Children's Health clinic in the Andes mountains near Cusco, Peru. Maternal and Child Health is one of Rotary's six areas of focus for District and Global grants.

Background Information

The indigenous people who live in remote communities have little or no access to medical and other health services. Few professionally trained Doctors are available and health clinics are virtually nonexistent. Doctors and trained nurses are only found in the larger towns 2.5 hours walk or specialized treatment more than 2 hours drive away (if transport is available). Travel over the mountainous terrain is slow and often dangerous at 4,000 metres above sea level. The people of Quishuarani, five hours drive from Cusco, live in a picturesque valley near the Huillquijasa Pass. They live without electricity, running water or proper sanitation. They cook over open fireplaces and smoke fills the one or two stone roomed houses.

The Need

Children suffer from malnutrition, pneumonia, bronchitis, whooping cough and influenza and more. The high altitude and poor diet results in many other diseases. Pregnant women have little or no health care facilities in which to give birth and infant mortality is high. 50% of child deliveries in the mountain regions are not in a hospital or health clinic.

Funding

Project coordinators, Stirling Rotary Club (D9520) Past President Trevor McGuirk and Ted Dziadkiewicz, member of the Rotary Club of North Melbourne (D9800), are seeking involvement of clubs in Districts 9520 and 9800 to provide \$2,000 - \$2,500 each to support this project during the initial start-up period of 3-5 years.

It is anticipated that additional funds will be attained through District and Global grant applications. A substantial donation from the Cameron Foundation has been guaranteed towards this project. See www.cameronfoundation.org

Other private donations will be sought. No money is required until July - August 2015. The Rotary Club of Cusco will assist in coordinating the project in Peru, along with "Wings" (a humanitarian NGO in Peru).



Rotary Foundation Record in 2014



Contributions to the Annual Fund and Endowed Fund during 2013-14 set records, and PolioPlus contributions continue to be very strong. **Contributions totaled more than a quarter billion dollars.**

Donors to the Foundation also reached new heights in these noteworthy areas:

- 27,689 clubs (approximately 80 percent of all Rotary clubs) contributed to the Annual Fund
- 367,629 individual Rotarians (30 percent of Rotary's membership) contributed to the Annual Fund
- In its first year as an official recognition program of The Rotary Foundation, the Paul Harris Society identified 10,143 members (each contributing \$1,000 each year). The global figure represents around 0.8% of Rotary membership around the world joined up as Paul Harris Society members, but the Australian PHS numbers are just over 1.3% of the total Australian membership.

With the momentum from this past year, we look forward to even greater achievements in 2014-15 and to reaching our worldwide Annual Fund goal for the year: \$123 million.


Club Reporting

Many Clubs will soon be holding their Annual General Meetings and selecting Club Officers for the

2015 – 2016 Rotary year. Club Secretaries are responsible for updating membership information – that is adding new members and removing terminated members within 30 days. They must also report incoming Club Officers by February 1st each year.

In addition, beginning on January 1st 2015, Rotary International is introducing a new billing system to collect the Semi Annual Dues. This will involve a simpler one-page invoice based on membership numbers on the RI database. To ensure accurate invoicing, membership changes should be reported within 30 days but in all cases, no later than January 1st or July 1st.

The easiest method of doing this is by going online. Go to rotary.org sign in to My Rotary then go to Manage → Club Administration → Add/Edit/Remove Member. All membership edits and updates are seamlessly taken in on the RI database without any delays or lags. All Club Officers are encouraged to have online accounts with My Rotary.



Reporting membership via email, fax (612-8894 9899) or the postal system (to PO Box 1415 Parramatta NSW 2124) can still be done but, as can be expected, will involve delays in being entered into the database.


