Council On Legislation 2016 - Update

Every three years, Rotarians meet at the Council on Legislation to review and vote on proposed legislation. The Council gives us a voice on how our organisation is governed.

The next Council convenes in April 2016. Legislation must be received at Rotary International by December 31st 2014 – there are no exceptions to this deadline. Every District sends a representative to the Council. Representatives deliberate and vote upon all proposed enactments and resolutions. Enactments seek to change Rotary's constitutional documents and resolutions express an opinion or make a recommendation to the Rotary International Board. No District can propose or support more than 5 enactments per Council.



Our District's Council on Legislation representative, PDG Peter Ochota, has put forward 5 items for consideration and approval by all the Clubs in the District. If approved, these proposed enactments will be forwarded to RI.

An information package, containing the proposals, has been circulated to all Club Presidents and Secretaries.

Rotary Peace Scholarships

We all wish for peace in our world. The Rotary Foundation contributes to this desire with the establishment of Rotary Peace Centres in various parts of the world. The program funds up to 100 Rotary Peace Fellowships per year for fellows to study at one of the Foundation's chosen universities.

The idea of the Rotary Peace Centres is to create a group of individuals who are dedicated to peace and conflict resolution and have been given the tools to succeed in their efforts.

Since the program began in 2002, nearly 900 peace fellows have been engaged in peace activities throughout the world, working for non-government organisations, government agencies, the World Health Organisation, World Bank etc. A target of US\$125 million has been set to fund the program during this Rotary year. This is an achievable goal but it needs our continuing financial support.

Heart Fruit Cake

- 500 gm. mixed fruit - sultanas (at least 200 gm.), apricots, prunes, pears, cranberries, dates, ginger
- 1 cup of orange juice +/- 2 tbsps. of Muscat

Mix and leave overnight

- Add 1 cup SR wholemeal flour - white flour is fine
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- Pour into a log tin
- Top with crushed nuts or sesame seeds (optional)
- Cook 40 minutes on 160° F
- Then 15 minutes on 180° F

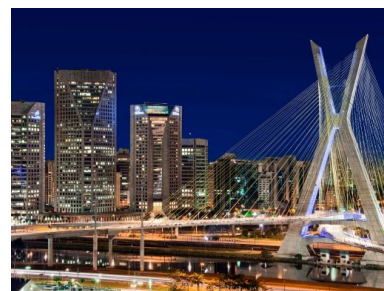

International Project – Funding Required

Is your club looking to participate in an International (Global) project for 2015 - 2016?

Why not consider the possibility of combining with other clubs in D9520 and contribute to the establishment of a Women's and Children's Health clinic in the Andes mountains near Cusco, Peru. Maternal and Child Health is one of Rotary's six areas of focus for District and Global grants.

Background Information

The indigenous people who live in remote communities have little or no access to medical and other health services. Few professionally trained Doctors are available and health clinics are virtually nonexistent. Doctors and trained nurses are only found in the larger towns 2.5 hours walk or specialized treatment more than 2 hours drive away (if transport is available). Travel over the mountainous terrain is slow and often dangerous at 4,000 metres above sea level. The people of Quishuarani, five hours drive from Cusco, live in a picturesque valley near the Huillquijasa Pass. They live without electricity, running water or proper sanitation. They cook over open fireplaces and smoke fills the one or two stone roomed houses.

The Need

Children suffer from malnutrition, pneumonia, bronchitis, whooping cough and influenza and more. The high altitude and poor diet results in many other diseases. Pregnant women have little or no health care facilities in which to give birth and infant mortality is high. 50% of child deliveries in the mountain regions are not in a hospital or health clinic.

Funding

Project coordinators, Stirling Rotary Club (D9520) Past President Trevor McGuirk and Ted Dziadkiewicz, member of the Rotary Club of North Melbourne (D9800), are seeking involvement of clubs in Districts 9520 and 9800 to provide \$2,000 - \$2,500 each to support this project during the initial start-up period of 3-5 years.

It is anticipated that additional funds will be attained through District and Global grant applications. A substantial donation from the Cameron Foundation has been guaranteed towards this project. See www.cameronfoundation.org

Other private donations will be sought. No money is required until July - August 2015. The Rotary Club of Cusco will assist in coordinating the project in Peru, along with "Wings" (a humanitarian NGO in Peru).

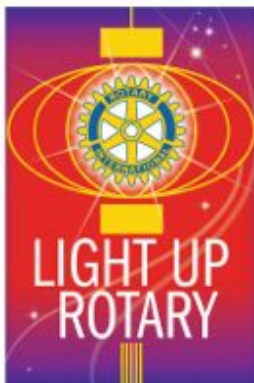
