Rotary Carousel @ Semaphore – Assistants Required

Duration – Saturday 13th December 2014 to Monday 26th January 2015 inclusive (excludes Christmas Day).

The Rotary Club of Henley Beach is the Manager of the Carousel situated on the foreshore at Semaphore. The carousel is run as a “not for profit” program, i.e. all profits are donated to various Rotary and Non-Rotary charity programs.

During the Summer School Holidays the carousel will be run every day for at least 12 hours per day (temperatures permitting) except Christmas Day.

Assistants are generally required to help with the operation of the carousel by collecting tickets before public board the carousel, ensure that riders are correctly seated and do not engage in risky behaviour and report any incidents to the daily carousel operator.

Rotarians & Friends of Rotary are invited to register to be an assistant at the Carousel on their nominated shifts on week days only during the mentioned dates in accordance with the following information.

Assistants are required to participate in minimum 4 hourly shifts 10:30am to 2:30pm, 2:30pm to 6:30pm and 6:30pm to 10:30pm. Only 1 person per shift is required as an Assistant. Assistants will sign on and off on a Daily register which ensures they are covered by Rotary Insurance and for payment of fee for service to their assigned Rotary club. Assistants are asked to be at the Carousel 30 minutes before their designated shift to ensure they are satisfactorily instructed of their duties and ensures continuity of the shifts. Assistants are reminded that during the Summer School Holidays the foreshore is full of other Show rides and activities which draws large crowds all day every day, therefore there will be extreme difficulty finding a parking space close to the venue, therefore you need to allow more time before your intended arrival. Assistants are not required to assist people onto or off the rides – young or incapacitated riders will usually have a carer ride with them (no charge).

Rotary Club of Henley Beach will pay a minimum fee of **\$15.00** per hour into the relevant Rotary Club's Project Account to which the Assistant is attached. At the completion of the Christmas School Holidays all attendances will be totalled and the appropriate fees calculated and paid into the relevant Rotary Clubs Project Accounts as part of their Fundraising.

Assistants who work the last shift each day will be required to help count the daily takings, take possession of the Notes which form part of the daily takings, then take those monies home and cause them to be handed to their Rotary Club Treasurer or appropriately banked into the Carousel Account as soon as reasonably practicable after that day (at Club Treasurers discretion). Daily takings are not left on the Carousel premises. An additional fee will be paid to those Rotary Clubs who manage the daily takings. Excess Coins will be removed periodically by Henley Rotarians.

Fill in all the relevant details and select the appropriate dates and shifts they would like to work as an Assistant. Persons who have registered for a specific shift should arrange a replacement if they are unable to fulfil their shift. The carousel cannot operate without an Assistant present.

Conference Speaker Preview

Juliet Ramzan – Rotary Peace Scholar



Juliet has recently returned to Australia after spending two years as a Rotary Peace Fellow at Uppsala University in Sweden where she completed a Masters of International Politics (Peace and Conflict Studies). In addition to course work, Juliet's studies in Sweden focused on the topic of Rule of Law in preventing civil conflicts. Her masters' thesis examined this topic through a quantitative research design.

During her time as a Rotary Peace Fellow, Juliet undertook an Applied Field Experience at Johns Hopkins University in Bologna, Italy where she received diplomacy and conflict resolution training from international leaders. Juliet then returned to Sweden where she worked at the Life and

Peace Institute in Uppsala.

Prior to taking up the Rotary Peace Fellowship, Juliet worked as a lawyer in Adelaide. She has also undertaken volunteer work in Argentina, India and most recently in Sri Lanka where she has worked on issues of human rights, environmental law and international war crimes.

Through the Rotary Peace Fellowship Juliet has been able to contribute to the growing research in civil conflict prevention and has extended her own knowledge of the efficacy of current practices in conflict resolution.

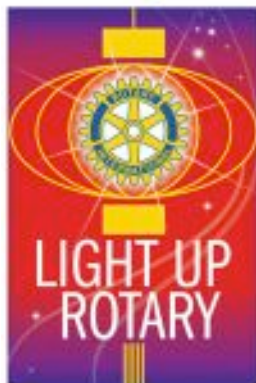
