January is Rotary Awareness Month

Rotary has a mission and a message and both can be summarized in a single word – 'Service'.

Creating awareness of our service function is called public relations. It starts internally with meaningful new member induction and mentoring and continues with ongoing Rotary information programs. This 'internal' public relations strengthens Rotary awareness within our own ranks.



Public relations become 'external' when we inform the public about Rotary. If we don't tell them, they won't know that Rotary provides more International scholarships than any other organisation, or that Rotarians have contributed more than ¾ billion dollars towards polio eradication. If we don't tell them, they won't know about Rotary's world peace efforts through the Rotary Centres for International Studies in Peace and Conflict Resolution. Locally, Rotary Clubs sponsor a large number of projects that fulfill important needs. But we must make these services known, to ensure their benefits are fully realized. And if we don't tell the local public about Rotary, our new member recruitment is handicapped.

While Rotary Awareness is promoted in January, it is actually a constant challenge. Public relations is not just a task for a designated Chair and Committee. Every Rotarian represents Rotary, and it's the job of every dedicated Rotarian to create Rotary Awareness.

- This will be a great opportunity to promote Rotary and our Clubs



2015 Presidential Citation - Time to Apply



RI President Gary C.K. Huang has made a few changes to the "Light Up the Family of Rotary" section of the citation to make these goals more attainable for clubs. The specific changes are as follows:

- For the "Best Class" Club President's Challenge, points will be earned if either the Club President or Club President-elect registers to attend the São Paulo convention.
- Points can be earned if the club sponsors a new Rotaract club or Interact club or if it continues to sponsor one of these groups.
- Points can also be earned if the Club sponsors a new Rotary Community Corps or if it continues to sponsor an RCC.
- Clubs only need to score a minimum of 30 points in this section of the citation, instead of 40 as originally written.

As a reminder, Club Presidents should submit their Clubs' completed forms to the District Governor no later than 31st March 2015

The Rotary Club of Encounter Bay took over the management of these markets in January 2014 and have worked with traders, customers and local council to provide 2 busy, vibrant markets for the local community and tourists visiting the South Coast.



Goolwa Wharf market is held on the first and third Sundays of each month, every Sunday in January and extra markets on 27^{th} December and Good Friday. This Market trades from 9 am - 3.30 pm.

Goolwa Wharf Market is a large market with over 80 stalls, selling a huge range of goods from fresh produce to arts, plants, crafts and clothing to wine, olive oil, coffee and cakes, bread and takeaway food, as well as books DVDs and variety stalls.

The Port Elliot market is held on Lakala Reserve (Young St, Port Elliot) on the first and third Saturdays of each month, with extra markets on 27^{th} December and every Saturday in January. This market trades from 9 am -2 pm.

Port Elliot Market hosts around 40 stalls in a delightful 'village green' atmosphere. There is plenty of fresh produce and homemade jams, pickles, plants, olive oil, jewelry, clothing and books. There is also food and a delicious cappuccino stall. There is a lake with bird-life and a playground for the children.




