Sampson Flat bushfires were extinguished a short time ago, but the stress and turmoil to people's lives is starting to emerge. The Golden Grove Relief Centre heard many sad stories of loss and personal tragedies. Thankfully no one died, but many people are experiencing difficult times.



Rotary was at the relief centre from Thursday (8/1/15) operating under our MOU with Housing SA. Members from Golden Grove, Elizabeth, Modbury, Tea Tree Gully, Walkerville, Adelaide Light, Adelaide West and Playford clubs have been involved. We thank those people for their help. Many helped on several occasions. We also had Rotarians providing a BBQ at One Tree Hill Command Centre on Wednesday (7/1/15).

The people seeking assistance were grateful that our members were available to listen and help them start the recovery process just by being on hand. Red Cross and the people from Housing SA played a more significant role, but Rotary was their first connection with the relief centre process.



Expanding An Innovative & Flexible Rotary Club Pilot

Rotary International is expanding an Innovative and Flexible Club Pilot scheme, which will run from July 1st 2015 until June 30th 2017.



Clubs that are selected to take part in the Pilot will be able to temporarily change the standard RI Constitution and Club Byelaws to try:

- Different meeting locations and designs
- Innovative Club leadership structures
- Creative membership requirements
- To shift the focus from meeting attendance to member engagement

Eligible Clubs must:

- Have chartered before June 30th 2010
- Be in good financial standing
- Have a minimum of 20 members
- Demonstrate that ¾ Club members have voted to participate in the Pilot
- Not be participating in the 2011 -17 Membership Pilots

Participating Clubs need to:

- Appoint a Club Pilot Coordinator
- Submit specific reports twice yearly
- Maintain currents records on My Rotary and Rotary Club Central

Clubs are now invited to take part in this Pilot Scheme. Between 60-70 Clubs will be selected from Australia and New Zealand. The deadline for submitting applications is March 31st 2015.

- 2. If no sponsor Club comes forward, then we will be very happy to hear from keen supporters of the program who will be happy to fill those roles, with support from the District RYLA Committee

R-YPEN 2015 Launch

R-YPEN 2015 has been launched......



R-YPEN 2015 has been launched and applications are now open. The usual flyers and covering letter will have started arriving at all High Schools throughout the District from Monday, February 2nd.

The intention is to encourage School Counsellors to either approach specific students who they consider to be suitable, or to at least let the relevant age

group know about the program. Unfortunately, many will do nothing, as they already have more than enough to fill their day. This is where local clubs can seize the initiative, for history shows us that the clubs that get the best students are most often the clubs who have taken the trouble to make contact with School Counsellors to personally promote the program.

Clubs need to be aware of a couple of changes this year. Firstly, we've had to increase the cost for the first time in at least 4 years. The new prices are \$260 for a club's first applicant and \$245 for each additional one.

Copies of both the letter and the flyer are available from the RYLA/RYPEN website (click here). Secondly, we've changed the application form by bringing data collection online. After applicants have input all their relevant data, they are required to print a copy of that information, plus a copy of the Endorsement form that is used for all sign offs by parents/guardian and the club. Copies are available on the website.

The suggested action for each club's Youth Services Director is as follows;

- Actively engage with your local school(s)
- Read the flyer so you know what School Counsellors have received
- Review the R-YPEN website so you know what students will be doing on-line (address is ryla9520.org.au/rypen/details/)
- Contact your local schools and let the Counsellor know you are keen to sponsor good applicants
- Once you make contact with suitable students, please refer them to the application form online (click here).
- Please be sure to interview your student(s) to satisfy yourself that they are suitable
- Encourage your club members to put forward suggestions from the young people they know
 children, grandkids, relatives, friends, neighbours, work colleagues etc.
- Follow instructions for applications on website.

Vocational Training Team - Home Hosts Wanted



HOME HOSTS WANTED

VOCATIONAL TRAINING TEAM (VTT) Participants from TIMOR LESTE

PLEASE - Respond by 28th February 2015

PROJECT: D9520 and D9550 (& RC Dili, Timor Leste) are participating in a 3 stage Vocational Training Team (VTT) project. This VTT project will focus on English as Additional Language teacher training needs. Stage 1: Team leader plus 10 teachers from various secondary schools & from SOLS 24/7 (vocational education), in Timor Leste, will be visiting us from 15th April to 24th May 2015, to participate in a English as Additional Language teacher training program. Stages 2 & 3: Five teachers from here, split into 2 groups, will visit Timor Leste for 2 weeks, in July and in Sep/Oct school holidays. One group will deliver teacher training workshops to as many English language teachers as possible. The second group will be undertaking a comparative study of the English as Additional Language teacher training needs, to help develop a suitable teacher training program.

DATES for HOSTING:

15th April to 24th May 2015 - (excluding 16th to 19th of April). Approximately 5 weeks. (We plan to home host in Ballarat, for 16th to 19th April. The teachers will participate in the District Conference, visit local schools & connect with local organisations involved in East Timor education projects.

NUMBER of HOSTS:

11 Clubs/hosts - in the Adelaide area. The visitors will be encouraged to use public transport, where it is convenient. To improve English proficiency, we will place only one teacher per host family at any one time. Clubs can request to host more than one teacher if it wishes.

COSTS to the CLUB: Approximate cost, would be about \$1,000 for meals, transport, activities outings etc, to host one teacher for the 5 weeks. Similar to GSE. (Further details will be provided to the host Club representatives, at a group meeting for host Clubs.)




