Rotary Race Day – May 9th 2015**Opportunity for Club Displays and Sales**

The family fun race day on May 9th at Morphettville offers Rotary clubs the exciting opportunities of promoting their projects and/or fundraising from the general public.

As this is Derby Day in the SAJC calendar, we expect a large crowd of some thousands of traditional race goers, as well as families looking for an outing for the day. As well as a full race program, there will be lots of free fun activities for children.

Booths in units of 3 x 2 m with a trestle table and two chairs will be available free of charge in both the Endeavour Homes Pavilion and the concrete forecourt. The location is in the heart of the action, next the public grandstand and Champagne Lawns (which will have a club feel with a disco), and faces directly onto the track.

We have the whole ground floor available for club and district displays. Floor to ceiling glass doors open directly onto a view of the track near the winning post. A fashion parade is to be held on the first floor of the pavilion, which will attract even more patrons for your club display. A Yellow Duck Road will be run in conjunction with the displays to encourage the public to visit the booths. The plan and brochure will be handed out to all race-goers at the entrances.

There is an opportunity for clubs to sell food and drink to the race goers as well. A set price of \$3.00 will be charged for all food items. This is expected to cover all your costs and make a small profit. All profits are to go to the Eradicate Polio campaign and we can arrange for individual clubs to be credited with the Foundation for their contributions.

If clubs have foods to sell such as hamburgers, sausages, hot dogs, pancakes, doughnuts, biscuits, tea and coffee, water, spiders etc. we ask you to discuss your ideas and register with the contacts below.

The District RYLA Committee is currently looking for some enthusiastic supporters of the RYLA Program, who might be interested in playing a pivotal role in the development and or running of the 2015 program, which is currently planned for September 25th to October 2nd 2015. There are a couple of options:

1. If your Club would like to take on sponsorship of this year's seminar, all you need are some enthusiastic members. There is no requirement for the sponsor Club to make any financial outlay on the seminar – all we need is your enthusiasm and talent. The key roles to be filled are;
 - a. Administrator – Responsible for the overall planning, organisation and delivery of the program, working in close contact with the Lead Director and the Committee. Key skills are Leadership, Management, Communication and Integrity. Above all else, you need to love working with young people and be passionate about helping them develop new skills. If you would like to talk to a recent Administrator, ask AG Penni Hamilton Smith how much fun she had (Contact details in Directory)
 - b. Live in Parents – As the name implies, you will live “on site” for the duration of the seminar, providing support, mentoring and guidance particularly to the attendees, but also to the leaders. Again, you wouldn't even think of doing it unless you loved working with young people. Key skills are a sympathetic ear and coaching, teamwork and communication skills. Once again, DG Jerry and Briony, Peter Brooke-Smith and Peter Poulton will all be very happy to tell you about their experience in this role.
 - c. There are one or two other roles that require good administrative skills and some PC and Internet skills. Committee members will handle these roles unless the sponsor club prefers to nominate others.
2. If no sponsor Club comes forward, then we will be very happy to hear from keen supporters of the program who will be happy to fill those roles, with support from the District RYLA Committee

The most important attributes for successfully undertaking these roles are enthusiasm and a commitment to the younger generation. If you have those, then why not give us a call and at least explore the possibilities. You may think you don't have the time, but we're sure we can find a way if you are really keen.

R-YPEN 2015

R-YPEN 2015 has been launched.....

R-YPEN 2015 has been launched and applications are now open. The usual flyers and covering letter will have started arriving at all High Schools throughout the District from Monday, February 2nd.

The intention is to encourage School Counsellors to either approach specific students who they consider to be suitable, or to at least let the relevant age

group know about the program. Unfortunately, many will do nothing, as they already have more than enough to fill their day. This is where local clubs can seize the initiative, for history shows us that the clubs that get the best students are most often the clubs who have taken the trouble to make contact with School Counsellors to personally promote the program.

Clubs need to be aware of a couple of changes this year. Firstly, we've had to increase the cost for the first time in at least 4 years. The new prices are \$260 for a club's first applicant and \$245 for each additional one.

Copies of both the letter and the flyer are available from the RYLA/RYPEN website ([click here](#)). Secondly, we've changed the application form by bringing data collection online. After applicants have input all their relevant data, they are required to print a copy of that information, plus a copy of the Endorsement form that is used for all sign offs by parents/guardian and the club. Copies are available on the website.

The suggested action for each club's Youth Services Director is as follows;

- Actively engage with your local school(s)
- Read the flyer so you know what School Counsellors have received
- Review the R-YPEN website so you know what students will be doing on-line (address is ryla9520.org.au/rypen/details/)
- Contact your local schools and let the Counsellor know you are keen to sponsor good applicants
- Once you make contact with suitable students, please refer them to the application form online ([click here](#)).
- Please be sure to interview your student(s) to satisfy yourself that they are suitable
- Encourage your club members to put forward suggestions from the young people they know – children, grandkids, relatives, friends, neighbours, work colleagues etc.
- Follow instructions for applications on website.

Vocational Training Team – Home Hosts Wanted Urgently!!



URGENT NEED FOR EAST TIMORESE TEACHER HOSTS

We have not had many enquiries for hosting the 10 East Timorese teachers coming to Adelaide to improve their English teaching skills. This is quite concerning.

This is the district's first Vocational Training Team under the new Rotary Foundation guidelines and it is important that we make it a success. Through a 3-part program, which involves sending Adelaide based teacher trainers and evaluators to East Timor as well, we are expecting to have a long-term impact on the educational and economic development of this new country. The Ministry of Education in East Timor and the Australian government through AusAID, are fully supportive of this project.

All 10 teachers have been selected and it would be a major disappointment if we have to turn some down because we have not been able to find enough home hosts in Adelaide.

The ten (7 male and 3 female) are all senior teachers in English at schools and colleges in East Timor.

All we ask of home hosts is for bed, board friendship and English conversation for each teacher for four weeks in April/May. East Timorese are warm and gentle people and are a delight to host.

Because the teachers will be in class Monday to Friday, there will be limited opportunities and costs for clubs and hosts to entertain them. We expect the clubs to invite them to their weekly meetings and to take part in any club projects while they are here.

It would be great if we had 10 hosts from 10 clubs, but if clubs wanted to host more than one teacher that would be considered.

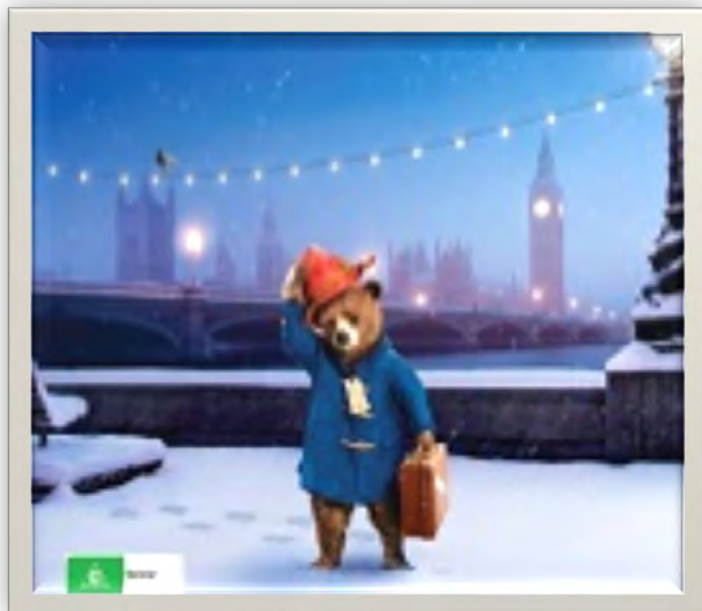
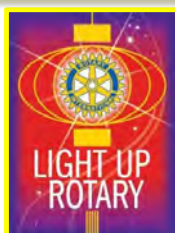

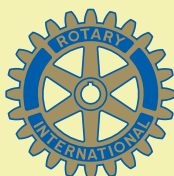
