Rotary Race Day – May 9th 2015**Opportunity for Club Displays and Sales**

The family fun race day on May 9th at Morphettville offers Rotary clubs the exciting opportunities of promoting their projects and/or fundraising from the general public.

As this is Derby Day in the SAJC calendar, we expect a large crowd of some thousands of traditional race goers, as well as families looking for an outing for the day. As well as a full race program, there will be lots of free fun activities for children.

Booths in units of 3 x 2 m with a trestle table and two chairs will be available free of charge in both the Endeavour Homes Pavilion and the concrete forecourt. The location is in the heart of the action, next the public grandstand and Champagne Lawns (which will have a club feel with a disco), and faces directly onto the track.

We have the whole ground floor available for club and district displays. Floor to ceiling glass doors open directly onto a view of the track near the winning post. A fashion parade is to be held on the first floor of the pavilion, which will attract even more patrons for your club display. A Yellow Duck Road will be run in conjunction with the displays to encourage the public to visit the booths. The plan and brochure will be handed out to all race-goers at the entrances.

There is an opportunity for clubs to sell food and drink to the race goers as well. A set price of \$3.00 will be charged for all food items. This is expected to cover all your costs and make a small profit. All profits are to go to the Eradicate Polio campaign and we can arrange for individual clubs to be credited with the Foundation for their contributions.

If clubs have foods to sell such as hamburgers, sausages, hot dogs, pancakes, doughnuts, biscuits, tea and coffee, water, spiders etc. we ask you to discuss your ideas and register with the contacts below.

Australian Rotary Health Indigenous Health Scholarship



Indigenous Health

❖ **2000** - the Rotary Club of Mitcham, under the vision and passion of member Geoff Bailey instigated the Indigenous Health Scholarship Project in partnership with the South Australian Department of Human Services.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders do not benefit from mainstream health services to the same extent as other Australians because:

- **Health services are not accessible to many, and particularly remote, Aboriginal communities.**
- **Mainstream health services often lack cultural sensitivity and remain unwelcoming places for many Indigenous peoples.** The Indigenous health workforce remains disproportionately low when compared to the number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders that make up the Australian population.

This Indigenous Health Scholarship program looked to address this situation.

❖ **2002** - Aleeta Dawes (now Fejo) was the first student in the program and graduated as a Doctor of Medicine in 2004. Aleeta recently received the inaugural Wakapi Anyiku Doctor Oomparani (Aboriginal Doctor for Everybody) Award in recognition of her passionate advocacy for Aboriginal health and her work in assisting Indigenous registrars.



❖ **2004** - program spread nationally and is now **Australian Rotary Health Indigenous Health Scholarship**

❖ **2014** - 82 students nationally were sponsored under the program

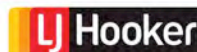
