Vale - Geoffrey Bailey OAM

Geoffrey Bailey, an esteemed member of the Rotary Club of Mitcham, passed peacefully away on March 17th, aged 88 years. Geoff joined Rotary in 1958 as a Charter member of the Rotary Club of Port Augusta. He subsequently was a member of the Rotary Clubs in Salisbury and Scottsdale, before joining Mitcham in 1976. In total, Geoff gave 56 years of selfless service to Rotary.



Geoff had a passionate interest in 'Closing the Gap' – improving the health of indigenous people across Australia. With the strong support of the Rotary Club of Mitcham, Geoff established the Australian Rotary Health Indigenous Health Scholarships Program. The program trains indigenous people as health care professionals to help their own communities. In 2013, 82 indigenous students across Australia were part of the scholarship program.

For his work in the area of indigenous health Geoff was awarded a Century Medal by the Australian Government in 2001 and in 2003 he received the Medal of the Order of Australia for service to the community through programs of the Rotary Club of Mitcham. In 2013 he also received the Australian Rotary Health Medal. Geoff was a Past President and Paul Harris Fellow (Double Sapphire Pin).

A memorial service to celebrate Geoff's remarkable life was held on Saturday, March 21st

Cyclone Pam - Vanuatu - Update

Vanuatu is warning it faces imminent food shortages as accounts emerge of huge damage to a large outer island, days after Cyclone Pam, one of the fiercest cyclones on record pummeled the Pacific archipelago.



Relief agencies have reported that conditions were among the most challenging they have faced, with concerns mounting that disease and a lack of clean water could add to the revised toll of 11 confirmed fatalities.

There are fears the death toll will also rise once officials reach outer islands to inspect the damage.

Communications were still down to many of Vanuatu's 80 other islands, most only accessible by boat, and Prime Minister Joe Natuman said it would be at least a

week before authorities had a better sense of the destruction.

ShelterBox Australia has sent assessment teams to Vanuatu and have a significant number of shelter boxes ready for deployment to the areas that have suffered the most damage.

In the meantime, it has been decided to coordinate our efforts at a District level. An initial contribution of \$5,000 has already been donated towards this disaster.

Kidney Health Australia - Big Red Kidney Bus Project

'On October 8th I will be embarking on a challenge to hike the Great Wall of China for five days in a remote area where there are many hills and thousands of rough steps. This is an important fund-raiser to replicate the Kidney Health Australia BIG RED KIDNEY BUS PROJECT in every state and territory in Australia. This 'World First' initiative is providing



mobile holiday dialysis in Victoria to Australians on dialysis. To be accepted as one of the hikers I must raise a minimum of \$3,500 AUD.

Many of you will already know that my wife, Joy, has kidney disease. Currently her kidney function is about 11%. Inevitably she will soon have to join the 11,000 Australians who must dialyse at least three days a week for five hours a day to stay alive.

One of the many difficulties patients experience when on dialysis is not being able to travel far from the hospital. They are only able to be away for a maximum of two nights, which makes having a holiday or travelling to visit family or friends mostly impossible. Although there are satellite dialysis centres and hospitals providing dialysis in many parts of Australia, it is difficult to access these because they do not have any vacant chairs. Because of these restrictions most people on dialysis choose to stay home, as it is all too hard to get away. Many have not had a holiday since they started dialysis, for as long as 20 years! Family members also miss out.

KHA has developed a world-first BIG RED KIDNEY BUS, which launched in Victoria last year. Staffed by two Monash University Health nurses and a renal technician it travels to a popular tourist destination and sets up there for around six weeks in a holiday park, before moving on to the next place. People on dialysis can book a chair several months ahead and finally enjoy a holiday with dialysis provided and easily accessible. The first Bus has been a wonderful success story and now we are seeking to have other retired buses donated, have them refurbished, fitted out and staffed and visiting popular holiday locations in other states. In the first three months of operation there were 112 bookings from dialysis patients coming from QLD, NSW, ACT, SA and Tasmania.






