District 9520 Conference in Ballarat, Thursday 16th - Sunday 19th April 2015

District 9520 Governor Nominee Designate

Assistant Governor Bob Cooper, from the Rotary Club of Burnside, has been nominated as the District 9520 Governor Nominee Designate. Bob will become District Governor in 2017 -2018.



Bob was a member of Jaycees International from 1979 to 1986 and was awarded life Membership a JCI Senator in 1985 after being a Chapter President in 1981, Regional President in 1983 and State President in 1985.

He was elected 4 times as a Councilor for the City of Burnside from 1987 to 1995 being appointed as chairman of various committees over the 8 years as an elected member of Council.

In 1996 Bob was invited to the Rotary Club of Glen Osmond and held various Committee Director positions and was Club President in 1999-2000 and 2007-2008. Both years the Club was recognised with a Rotary Presidential Citation Award. Bob was recognised by the Club in 2006 being awarded the Paul Harris fellow. The Rotary Club of Glen Osmond returned its Charter in 2009 and Bob was invited to join the Rotary Club of Burnside and he brought two projects, which he had coordinated over the past in the Rotary Club of Glen Osmond to the Rotary Club of Burnside. They were the National Parks Ranger of the Year and Volunteers of the Parks Awards presented annually and the City of Burnside elderly Citizens Christmas luncheon that still continue each year.

Bob was the President of the Rotary Club of Burnside in 2012-2013 when the Club was recognised by District 9520, being awarded the Membership Improvement Trophy, inducting 8 new members in that year. Also, the Club was recognised with a Rotary Presidential Citation Award. Last year Bob was selected as the District 9520 Assistant Governor for Group 6 Clubs.

Bob worked for ETSA and AGL for 38 years in a variety of roles ending up as National Account Executive in the Industrial and Commercial Sales area concluding in 2007. He then was appointed to the Sales and Operations Manager position for the Tasmanian Aurora Energy looking after the SA business until 2012.

Bob is married to Marilyn and they have 3 children and 3 grand children. They own a farm in the Adelaide Hills where they breed Angus cattle and have an award-winning garden, which keeps both of them busy.

Cyclone Pam - Vanuatu - Update

Vanuatu is warning it faces imminent food shortages as accounts emerge of huge damage to a large outer island, days after Cyclone Pam, one of the fiercest cyclones on record pummeled the Pacific archipelago.



Relief agencies have reported that conditions were among the most challenging they have faced, with concerns mounting that disease and a lack of clean water could add to the revised toll of 11 confirmed fatalities.

There are fears the death toll will also rise once officials reach outer islands to inspect the damage.

Communications were still down to many of Vanuatu's 80 other islands, most only accessible by boat, and Prime Minister Joe Natuman said it would be at least a

week before authorities had a better sense of the destruction.

ShelterBox Australia has sent assessment teams to Vanuatu and have a significant number of shelter boxes ready for deployment to the areas that have suffered the most damage.

In the meantime, it has been decided to coordinate our efforts at a District level. An initial contribution of \$5,000 has already been donated towards this disaster.







Trip to the Maldives & The Rotary Club of Malé

Following the outstanding success of the SA Rotary trip to the Maldives last September, another trip is being planned for September 2015. (Possibly leave Adelaide around 17th Sept, returning say 4th October).



Last year, 18 Rotarians from 7 different clubs in District 9520 enjoyed the combination of socialising with the local Rotarian families as well as other islanders, inspecting first-hand the water projects that our district had largely funded and touring on-board a safari boat to visit the delightful islands and great coral locations. Nearby Sri Lanka is also on the draft itinerary for 2015, again incorporating some Rotary projects funded by District 9520 into the itinerary to this intriguing country.

At this stage, Don Will from the Rotary Club of Eastwood is seeking registrations of interest from Rotarians and their families who may be interested in this 'expedition', after which the arrangements can be firmed up to suit the majority of travelers. Costs depend somewhat on the exchange rate, but the following should be used as a guide.

- Airfares from Adelaide to Malé (Maldives), onto Colombo (Sri Lanka) and back to Adelaide.
 Presently around A\$2,100 on Singapore Airlines & Sri Lanka Air.
- Component in the Maldives for say 10 days will be around A\$1,900/\$2,100, covering say 3
 or more nights hotel (very comfortable, en-suite but not 5 star) and up to 7 nights on a
 safari boat (also en suite facilities) and most meals. Be assured, this represents a
 saving on most travel in Maldives of more than 50% because we charter the entire
 vessel, and we go where we want to.
- Component in Sri Lanka. For say 6 days in Sri Lanka the cost should be around A\$1450, staying at luxury hotels, some meals included.

Travelers might choose to do one country rather than two (not sure why, as they are both so delightful and different) and/or incorporate this Indian Ocean time with a trip in Asia or onto Europe (Maldives are as close to London as they are to Adelaide).


As 8 of the 20 places have already been tentatively booked, registrations of interest are now urgently sought to secure a spot.
