

hile our Disaster Aid Response Team members (DARTs) – including Australians – are being assembled and briefed, we are already looking to move pre-positioned stock from India and elsewhere, ready to be deployed when assessments and logistics have been completed, in conjunction with other agencies and local Rotarians. Our 2014 deployment to Nepal brought significant relief after the autumn floods.

As we know from heartbreaking media reports, access is extremely difficult and indications are that as well as non-perishable food items, safe water and shelter are the vital aid items. And it is those *latter* two where we can provide effective assistance, just as we recently did in Vanuatu* and before that, in the Philippines (where, in both countries, our work goes on.) *

As per latest available information over 5000 people have lost their lives and over 10000 are seriously injured throughout Nepal with large-scale destruction to property. In Kathmandu, many people are camping out in the open areas due to fear of aftershocks, which is continuing even today The hilly areas and remote locations, not accessible have been the hardest hit by this natural calamity.

Rotary Oceanic Medical Aid for Children





Since its inception by a Rotary District in Victoria in 1987 this humanitarian program has been adopted and supported by all Districts in Australia and New Zealand and has provided over 400 children from more than 20 developing countries in the Oceania region with urgent medical treatment that has saved their lives or given them new hope for a better life. It is run only by volunteer Rotarians.

I am pleased to remind clubs and Rotarians that unlike other similar medical programs, as good as they may be, that ROMAC is the only one that has been approved and supported by Rotary International and proudly displays the Rotary Logo. ROMAC is assisted by many eminent Australian and New Zealand surgeons who without the program could not function and like the Rotarians that run ROMAC usually very generously donate their time for the treatment of our patients. Our Patrons include the Governor of South Australia His Excellency the Honourable Hieu Van Le AO.

District 9520 and 9500, Central Region, is one of six regions including New Zealand. The joint district committee is chaired by PDG Alun Hughes from the Rotary Club of Salisbury in District 9500. Other committee members volunteer to be on the committee from the Rotary Clubs of Burnside, Hallett Cove, Brownhill Creek, Somerton Park, Tea Tree Gully and Elizabeth.

The most recent patients in the Central Region have come from Timor Leste and have been hosted by the Rotary Clubs of Hallett Cove and Burnside and one due to the urgency was housed at Ronald McDonald House at North Adelaide and the other due to very short notice was housed at a University student residence in the suburb of Rose Park. These patients were all treated in the Adelaide Women and Children's hospital.














Our next patient will be arriving sometime in July for treatment in the Memorial Hospital and the committee are seeking a host Rotary Club and family. Patients arrive with a parent who looks after their personal needs. The host family are required to house and feed them and the host club record in their board minutes the names of the patient and carer so they are covered by Rotary Insurance and assist in transporting their charges to a from the hospital. All Rotarian's who come in contact with the child must have National Police Check clearances. Usually the host club covers the cost of caring for the patient/carer as a donation to ROMAC but some costs can be claimed from ROMAC if required. 
