# ROTARY DISTRICTS 9520 & 9550 & THE ROTARY CLUB OF DILI TIMOR LESTE ENGLISH TEACHER TRAINING PROJECT

VOCATIONAL TRAINING TEAM (VTT) NO 2 VISIT TO TIMOR LESTE - 4<sup>TH</sup> TO 17<sup>TH</sup> JULY 2015

#### Project Update - for all Clubs in D9520 & D9550

This is a Rotary Foundation supported Global Grant project jointly funded by D9520 and D9550. On behalf of D9550, Bob, David, Cristina and Crystal of the Rotary Club of Dili are helping the two Districts to implement this VTT project.

This VTT project is made up of 3 teams – totalling 16 participants. Brief details are:

- Vocational Training Team #1 (incoming) is made up 11 participants they are Toni (team leader from RC Dili) and 10 English language teachers (representing 5 Districts, from 7 Secondary Schools and SOLS Centre). The 10 teachers are Teo (Aileu District), Luis and Henrique (from Liquica), Zelia, Adelina, Mateus, Jose and Marquita (from Baucau), Pedro (Manatutu) and Marcos (Dill). They were in Adelaide from 15<sup>th</sup> April to 24<sup>th</sup> May 2015, and participated in an English teacher training program.
- ✓ Vocational Training Team #2 (outgoing) is made up of 3 teachers Kathy (team leader), Bronwen and Wendy. These teachers are going to Timor Leste from 4<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> July 2015 during the school holidays. During which, they will assist VTT#1 teachers to implement the training that they received in Adelaide and they will conduct number of full day and part day workshops for other teachers, assisted by VTT#1 teachers.
- ♣ Vocational Training Team #3 (outgoing) is made up of 2 teachers James and Jessie (team leader). Jessie is the only Rotarian in the 2 outgoing teams. These two teachers will go to Timor Leste in the September/October school holidays for 2 weeks. They will evaluate this VTT program and help identify training needs of Timor Leste English language teachers. I will provide an update on them at later date.

#### Your Help is needed – asap - please

- 1. Donation of \$200 250 to cover internet costs in Timor Leste for our 5 outgoing members. Our teachers need to access internet, whilst in Timor Leste, to communicate with family & for their workshops etc. These costs cannot be recovered from TRF Global Grant. The Rotary Club of Dili doesn't have financial resources to cover needs of our 2 teams. It is the only Rotary Club in East Timor. The funds that I thought was available for this expense, was given to Days for Girls project. Your donation will be paid directly to the VTT 2 & 3 members.
- 2. Donation of a working digital LitePro/Overhead projector our teachers visit to Timor Leste School has been welcomed by many. Many rural teachers will travel long distances to participate in the workshops. A projector would help to deliver the workshops more easily. These schools have no equipment. After the workshops are finished with your permission we would like to donate the equipment to VTT #1 school. See below program for the VTT#2 schedule in Timor Leste.

# **Rotary Club of Berri - RAWCS Project**

#### **Container of Goods to Timor Leste**



The Rotary Club of Berri is seeking funding support to continue this annual project. The project involves sending containers of Donations in Kind goods to the Rotary Club of Dili, Timor-Leste

#### **Project details:**

- Our RAWCS representative in Dili will send us a "wish List" of goods that they have identified
  as being needed. We contact them if something is donated to us to see if they need it before
  we send it.
- DIK in Adelaide also offer goods that they have available.
- Cost of the project is expected to be about \$12,000 for freight for a 40ft container and \$800 for landing fees.
- We would be pleased to accept any donations of suitable goods and assistance with packing.
- The goods are distributed in Dili by the DIK representative Rotarian Daryl Mills to organisations that are recognized for their needs and ethical practices.
- It is difficult to estimate how many people benefitted from the consignment, perhaps several thousand.
- Previous consignments have contained clothes, newborn baby tunics, medical instruments and dressings as well sewing machines, one dental chair and lifting machines and huge amounts of school chairs and school desks and exercise books.
- We are happy to provide space to other Clubs for transportation of goods for their projects.




