New Assistant Governors



Don Will has now been a Rotarian for more than half his life. Born in Gawler he spent his youth on a vineyard in the Barossa. At the age of 15 he won a Rotary Essay Competition entitled 'What the youth of Gawler need most'. The youth centre proposed became a project of the Rotary Club of Gawler.

Studying at Adelaide University convinced Don that joining clubs or organisations is essential for one to assimilate into a community (a message he now believes Rotary needs to adopt for professional immigrants coming to Australia).

Don's career has been a series of projects using a combination of his engineering and accounting qualifications, and a lot of general management. Following periods as General Manager of the Naval Military & Air Force Club of SA, then the Royal Adelaide Golf Club, Don established a business in 2007 that is now Adelaide's largest serviced office and meeting room operation, occupying four sites in the CBD.

Don joined the Rotary Club of Hyde Park in 1983, Barossa Districts in 1986, then back to Hyde Park, before being Charter President of the Rotary Club of Eastwood in 1992. This was followed by a period on the District Committee, during which the Rotary Clubs of Magill Sunrise and Kent Town were established. Perhaps Don's 'Rotary moment' came in 2013 when, along with Ahmed Ranesh from the Maldives, the Rotary Club of Male (Maldives) was chartered, with our District being responsible for taking Rotary to the 207th country in the world.

Recently Don accepted DGE Dick Wilson's invitation to become Assistant Governor of the Group 7 Clubs.

Many Clubs and individuals have planned to make donations to The Rotary Foundation at the end of the Rotary year. **There is still time to do this by using electronic transfer.** If the money is transferred by midnight on June 30th, you can still claim your tax deduction for 2014 – 2015 financial year. The details for electronic transfers are:

- Description Field: enter either AF (Annual Programs Fund half the donation will come back to the District in 3 years time, for use in projects which Clubs decide) or Polio - followed by your RI Club number

Personal Donations

- BSB 332 084; Account # 551 038 195; Account Name Australian Rotary Foundation Trust
- Description Field: enter either AF or Polio followed by your RI Club number
- After submitting your payment, print and keep a copy of your bank's acknowledgement for tax purposes

Good Records

- Clubs will shortly be receiving their Semi Annual Reports (SAR) for July.
- Subscriptions for the Rotary Down Under Magazine (RDU) are again being issued separately.
- Calculations for both SAR and RDU are based on membership figures on June 1st 2015
- After July 1st, incoming Club Officers will be able to keep membership records current through My Rotary. This is a good time to "spring clean' and update telephone numbers and email and postal addresses.



Centurion Reminder



We are fast approaching the end of the Rotary year. This is a time when many Rotarians renew their Centurion donation – at least \$100 per year to the Rotary Foundation, which is tax deductible. Contributions also count towards a Paul Harris Fellow.

All Centurion contributions count towards a Club's Annual Giving total. It is also part of the District's contribution, resulting in 50% of the contribution coming back for use as support funds for the programs we want to promote.

Rotarians can make individual donations and alternatively Clubs are encouraged to make donations on behalf of members.

Importantly, all Centurion donations must be accompanied by the appropriate Donor form.

Thank you to Jerry Casburn, Oleh Bilyk, Samone Wear from the Platinum Event Agency and the Rotary Committee for their tireless work in bringing together the Rotary Family Fun Day Races. This was a mammoth effort, requiring much dedicated work leading up to the Race Day.

It was a pleasure to work with Samone Wear. I can still remember the Facebook post that read "help needed to create a commercial for Rotary, roughly 10 hours editing required." I have been a

keen supporter of Rotary due to seeing your results in my home town of Strathalbyn, so I was very keen to help, and looking forward to doing what was needed to spread the word about the Rotary Family Fun Day Races.

Video is an excellent tool for the promotion of an event such as this one. To give you some background, it normally takes 2 weeks to create the quality video that was produced for Rotary. Then an additional 2 weeks to get the video TV ready - you should see the pages of specifications required!

TV stations normally need to have a commercial booked 3 months in advance. Needless to say, the video project certainly wasn't smooth sailing! Firstly, the 7-day turn around schedule was like creating a miracle from the starting gates! The next challenge came when I viewed the supplied video footage - it was poor quality and unusable. The tight deadline was a constant challenge.

However, having a dedicated team supporting me, we managed to complete the video just in the nick of time.

Group 5 Meeting - Australian Rotary Health



Group 5 Meeting Australian Rotary Health Night with Louise Mewton

Dr. Louise Mewton is the inaugural recipient of the Australian Rotary Health Bruce Edwards Post Doctorial Fellowship.

You are invited to hear her insight into issues around Mental Health

Her presentation will focus on the relationship between mental illness and the brain, and novel avenues of prevention informed by this connection between psychiatry and neuroscience. In particular, her presentation will focus on the use of internet-delivered brain training games as a means of preventing mental illness during the critical adolescent period.



Louise completed her PhD at the National Drug and Alcohol Research Centre, University of New South Wales in 2012, and was subsequently appointed a post-doctoral fellow and adviser at the Clinical Research Unit for Anxiety and Depression at St Vincent's Hospital, Sydney.

Her research includes some 29 publications, focusing on the prevention of mental illness in adolescents which has been widely translated into policy and practice. Louise has presented at numerous national and international conferences and is indeed a highly credentialed appointee.

The Australian Rotary Health Bruce Edwards Post Doctorial Fellowship gives Louise \$75,000 per year for 3 years to study 'Mental Health' and will be our guest speaker at the Rotary Club of Adelaide, lunch time 12th August and our Group 5 meeting in the evening.

Container of Goods to Timor Leste



The Rotary Club of Berri is seeking funding support to continue this annual project. The project involves sending containers of Donations in Kind goods to the Rotary Club of Dili, Timor-Leste

Project details:

- Our RAWCS representative in Dili will send us a "wish List" of goods that they have identified
 as being needed. We contact them if something is donated to us to see if they need it before
 we send it.
- DIK in Adelaide also offer goods that they have available.
- Cost of the project is expected to be about \$12,000 for freight for a 40ft container and \$800 for landing fees.
- We would be pleased to accept any donations of suitable goods and assistance with packing.
- The goods are distributed in Dili by the DIK representative Rotarian Daryl Mills to organisations that are recognized for their needs and ethical practices.
- It is difficult to estimate how many people benefitted from the consignment, perhaps several thousand.
- Previous consignments have contained clothes, newborn baby tunics, medical instruments and dressings as well sewing machines, one dental chair and lifting machines and huge amounts of school chairs and school desks and exercise books.
- We are happy to provide space to other Clubs for transportation of goods for their projects.




