Mosquito nets treated with an insecticide are very effective to help keep mosquitoes away from people, and thus greatly reduce the infection and transmission of malaria.




Those most at risk in Papua New Guinea cannot afford the cost of treated nets, so they need your help. Malaria greatly reduces productivity, so help these people help themselves.

The majority of slaves can be found in India and Africa. Everyone has a role to play to ending slavery, governments, consumers, Rotary clubs and YOU.


