Rotarian Will Owen was welcomed into the family of Rotary by a large group of assembled well-wishers.

Our first key note speaker is PDG Noel Trevaskis OAM.

Noel is Project Lead for Membership Development for Australia, New Zealand and the South Pacific. Noel joined Rotary as a member of the Rotary Club of Goulburn Argyle in 1996, and is now a member of the Rotary Club of Bega.

During his year of President he became involved with Australian Rotary Health and the program of Community Mental Health Awareness Forums. Noel was one of the most sought after speakers for the program, travelling around Australia telling his story to help raise awareness of mental health and to help break down the stigma attached to this illness. In 2005, Noel was recognized for his efforts when he was made a Member of the Order of Australia. He is still in high demand by all areas of media, nationally and internationally to speak about mental health issues.



In 2003, Rotary International awarded Noel the Service Above Self Award which is the highest individual award a Rotarian can receive. Noel served as District 9710 Governor in the year 2005/06. In 2007, Noel commenced a 2 year term as Regional Rotary International Membership Coordinator for Zone 8. In 2011 he was appointed to the position of Rotary Coordinator for part of Zone 8 for 3 years. In 2013 Noel was appointed to the Rotary International Advisory Committee for Membership Development a position he will hold until 2016. Noel will become a Director on the Board of Rotary International in June 2016 for a period of two years.

YOUNG CARERS PROJECT

Here are some staggering statistics on a largely hidden situation in our communities.

There are over 15,000 children in South Australia under the age of 15 years who are the sole carer of a parent or sibling.

These children look after a family member with a chronic illness, a physical and/or intellectual disability, mental health issues, sensory impairment or drug or alcohol dependency!!

This responsibility robs these young carers of their childhood, it takes away their study time, and their social interactions with friends and peers, as they devote themselves to the personal and often quite intimate care of a family member. This immense burden takes its toll on the development of their own lives when these young carers are left unsupported or assisted in some way.

Young Carers in association with Carers South Australia, would like to run a series of art workshops with these young people to reduce their sense of isolation, and support them as they grow to maturity. Hosted by the Campbelltown City Council this meeting had representatives from the Rotary Clubs of Campbelltown, Magill Sunrise and Morialta, along with Lions Club, Kiwanis, and Inner Wheel together celebrating their contributions to the well being of others in both local and more distant communities.





Guest Speaker His Excellency the Hon. Governor Hieu Van Le spoke of the kindness and generosity of Australian communities that greeted him and his family when they arrived. He always feels the need to give something back to the Australian community. Governor Hieu said the ethos of service clubs exemplify the spirit of giving and improving the lives of others in need. He said despite the efforts of service clubs and other humanitarian organizations, we are constantly reminded of the miseries of the world and the need and demand of service clubs are even greater. The questions for service clubs around the world is how to make them more effective and relevant to the young people of the society. What he learns from working with the multicultural communities is that Australia has been enriched by people with diverse ethnic, social and cultural backgrounds. Between 2001 to 2006, there were greater numbers of migrants from Africa, Middle East and Asia than from the traditional areas. He cited Australia has the highest diversity of migrant communities in the world.

Governor Hieu Van Le said he was pleased to see many migrants in the service clubs, but he would like to see more clubs find a way to open doors to welcome and integrate migrants in their clubs to reflect the diverse background of the community, especially the new and younger generations.


