CYBER SAFETY WORKSHOPS HELD IN WAIKERIE

The Rotary Club of Waikerie organised cyber safety workshops for students drawn from a number of Riverland Schools. Key Speakers, Senior Constables Chris Evans and Paul Wood conducted a series of 4 workshops in the Riverland Region to bring very important messages to students and parents on staying safe when using social media. The digital machines that are readily available to most young people are a powerful means of communication that allows much that is positive in their lives. There are however some negative aspects of social networking, online gaming, and geotagging that can have serious personal and sometimes legal consequences for users when this powerful form of communication is mis-used. Many students are not aware of the long term consequences of being drawn into cyber bullying, sexting and sending abusive messages, and the workshops brought these aspects of personal safety, and caution into sharp focus for audiences which in total exceeded 400 students, parents and friends.

The community response to these workshops reflected the worth of bringing the cyber safety message to especially the students in the Riverland communities.
