DEFIBRILLATOR DONATION TO SAVE LIVES

SA Ambulance intensive care paramedic Kieran Johnson has lobbied to have a number of defibrillators located around Renmark in a bid to keep the community safe.

"If a defibrillator is used within the first four minutes of a sudden cardiac arrest, that is pretty much the only thing that will save that person." Keiran.

Paramedic Kieran Johnson, Recreation Centre Manager Alan Coulter, and President RC Renmark Barry Hurst inspect the installation of a defibrillator purchased by the Rotary Club of Renmark and located in the Renmark Recreation Centre.

Paramedic Kieran urged anyone to access the equipment in the event of an emergency. "Essentially once the device is turned on it will tell you exactly what to do from start to finish with step-by-step instructions."

COME AND TRY CALPERUM

Calperum Station in the Riverland north of Renmark, is the centre of one of Rotary's biggest environmental programs in Australia. The property is a former Sheep Station of 3500 square kilometres and is now under the management of the Australian Landscape Trust for conservation, research and education purposes.

More than a dozen Clubs from Districts 9500 and 9520 visit the Station (some several times each year) to assist in environmental recovery, vegetation re-establishment, water quality monitoring, tree health assessment, as well as a number of Rotary Projects. These are usually accompanied by a number of social and sight-seeing and boating activities. Calperum abounds in wildlife - beautiful birds, flocks of kangaroo and emu, goannas, and even little echidnas just a few metres from the house. And you may have forgotten the amazing star-scape seen from a country vantage!

The Rotary Calperum Committee is running a **Come-and-Try weekend from Friday to Sunday, 6-8 November** and all Rotarians are invited to see for themselves the great work that the Trust and Rotary are doing and having a most enjoyable time in the process. Renmark is an easy 3 hour drive from Adelaide (with Bakery stops on the way!) and Calperum is only 10 minutes drive north. There is ample comfortable accommodation on site and as we take our own food and linen, there is no charge for Rotarians.

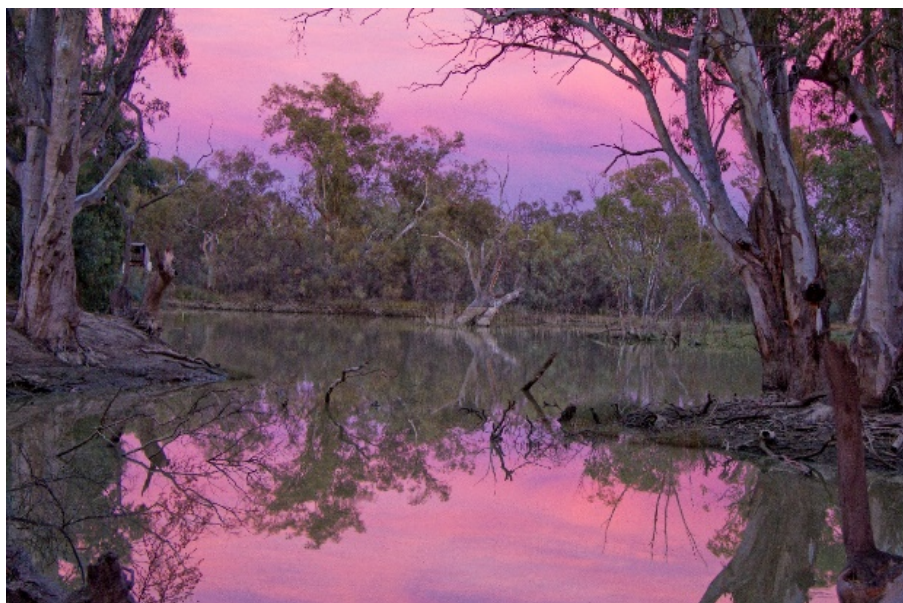

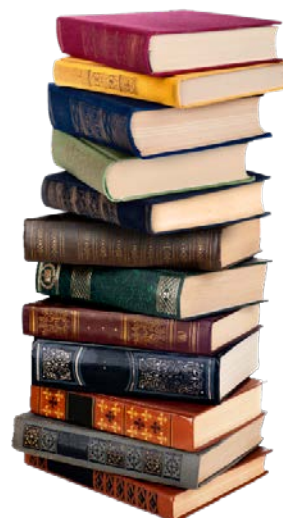
