
LENDING A HAND TO PEACE

EVANSTON, III. (13 January 2016) — Rotary announces \$35 million in grants to support the global effort to end polio. In 2015, the world saw historic progress against the paralyzing disease, with just two countries — Afghanistan and Pakistan — reporting a single strain of the wild virus. If the current momentum is strengthened, this year may mark the last case of wild poliovirus.

"We are closer than ever to achieving a polio-free world," said Michael K. McGovern, chair of Rotary's International PolioPlus Committee. "To ensure that no child ever again suffer the devastating effects of this disease, we must all ensure that the necessary funds and political will are firmly in place in 2016."

Have you heard of the Big Red Kidney Bus?

There is only one BRKB in the world and it was launched in Melbourne in October 2014. Two more BRKBs will, hopefully, be available in Western Australia and New South Wales by the end of 2016. It would be truly wonderful if South Australia could boast a BRKB by the end of 2017.

In October 2015, nine people from around the country hiked for five days, at their own expense, along the more remote parts of the Great Wall of China to raise money for BRKBs (I was one of them). We raised over \$51,400.

A Big Red Kidney Bus costs about \$150,000 to be fully fitted out, so what is involved.

Very briefly a BIG RED KIDNEY BUS is fitted out with three dialysis chairs and staffed by a renal nurse and a technician. Thousands of Australians have chronic kidney disease (CKD) and must have dialysis every second day of their lives to stay alive. Being a slave to dialysis means it is almost impossible to go away for a holiday or visit friends and family because it is extremely difficult to arrange dialysis elsewhere.

The BRKB is designed to help those on dialysis to have a holiday away from home, some for the first time in over 20 years or more. The world's first BRKB travels around favourite tourist destinations in Victoria and dialysis patients and their families from anywhere in the country can travel there, stay in nearby accommodation and have life-sustaining dialysis whilst on holidays. 444 patients and their families have already benefitted. PS Industry River Cruises and Calperum Visits



Every member of your Rotary Club can set up an Online Account with My Rotary. This would mean that every member of your Rotary Club could access all the learning tools in My Rotary, watch the progress of Club Goals being reached, as well as manage any changes to their contact information.





2016 Council on Legislation

Every three years all Rotary clubs and districts in the world have the opportunity to submit proposals to change the Rotary International (RI) Constitutional documents and to make recommendations to the RI Board. Following review and sometimes consolidation by RI staff, these proposals are considered and voted on by the Council on Legislation (COL), which comprises a representative from each of the 535 Districts in the Rotary world. At the end of this process a revised version of the Rotary policy reference guide *Manual of Procedure* is produced, incorporating all approved changes.

As part of the three-year cycle, all clubs/districts were invited to submit proposals in late 2014. District 9520 endorsed and submitted the following five proposals which have been included in the main document referred to below:

16-22 To allow clubs flexibility in structuring their weekly meetings

16-27 To revise attendance requirements

16-38 To revise the provisions for membership

16-54 To amend the duties of the president

16-95 To amend the terms of reference for the Strategic Planning Committee

RI staff have reviewed all proposals and consolidated them where identical or similar proposals were received, resulting in a 450-page document with details of 181 proposals, of which 16 were subsequently withdrawn. The remaining 165 proposals will be debated, discussed and voted on at the forthcoming COL, which will be held in Chicago from 10th to 15th April this year. It is my privilege and pleasure to represent D 9520 at this COL.

This document is somewhat daunting, however I encourage Rotarians to at least look at the first eleven pages which list the headings of the proposals under various groupings, and follow up those which they find particularly interesting and/or controversial. Should you have difficulty downloading the full document, or if you would like me to send you a shorter document with a list of proposals (indicating those which have been withdrawn), please feel free to contact me.

As District 9520 representative at the 2016 COL, I will base my votes on the written proposals and the discussions at the COL, however I would be happy to receive any comments from Rotarians and/or clubs to help me form a view on how to vote. Remember this is your opportunity to contribute to the democratic process which determines the future of Rotary.
