This has to rate as an amazing story where Rotarians from across the world have combined to provide a specialist machine that will save the lives of thousands of very sick young children.

The Rotary Club of Liverpool Garston in England is pleased to announce a Global Grant principally organised and funded by The Rotary Club of Victor Harbor in Australia, Rotary Clubs in District 1180 England, and Rotary International in America, has been used to provide £24,000 towards a portable X-ray machine at Alder Hey Children's Hospital.

Alder Hey offers over 20 specialist services including cancer, heart, spinal and brain disease. It is a designated major trauma centre; epilepsy centre; and craniofacial surgery centre. Children and young people from all over the UK and beyond come to Alder Hey in need of specialist treatment every year.

Over 60,000 young patients are seen every year.

For children who are either unable to get out of bed, in intensive care or in theatre, a mobile x-ray enables the radiology team to x-ray the child in their bed space or at the operating table.

Ian says that meaningful partnerships with corporations and other organizations are crucial to Rotary's future. "We have the programs and personnel and others have available resources. Doing good in the world is everyone's goal. We must learn from the experience of the polio eradication program to maximize our public awareness exposure for future partnerships."

Rotary Club of Broken Hill South has been fortunate for many years to be able to use a shed generously provided by the Broken Hill Community Credit Union to store their equipment. Due to renovations the shed is no longer available and so South Rotary set about securing a site for their own use.

After being successful with their application from Government for a grant to develop a site, RC of Broken Hill South have negotiated with Broken Hill City Council for the use of a block of land for a peppercorn rent. 
The Shed – "Rotary on Linde" is open every Saturday morning from 8.30 until 12 noon.

### Raising Awareness for CYSTIC FIBROSIS.

At Tuesday's meeting of the Rotary Club of Magill Sunrise, we welcomed friend of the club, **Susan Gascoine** (Spouse of club member Chris) to talk on her pledge to **walk from Renmark to Adelaide** to raise awareness for **Cystic Fibrosis (CF)** from 16<sup>th</sup> April until 22<sup>nd</sup> May. Having a **grand daughter** who **suffers from CF** prompted Susan to start planning an event to raise awareness of this disorder, and to raise \$10,000 to help ongoing research into finding a cure.

**Cystic Fibrosis** is the most common inherited, life threatening disorder in Australia. More than 300 South Australians living with CF require significant daily medications and physiotherapy and frequent hospitalisation. It is a seriously life-threatening condition for which there is currently no cure.

Despite major advances in the treatment of CF, only 50% of those born with this condition currently reach their late thirties.

Magill Sunrise is proudly supporting Susan's 'Renmark to City 4 CF' and are donating the proceeds from the April market towards her fundraising. This \$560 added to the \$4,000 Susan has already raised means she is slowly getting closer to her goal amount. 
