Here is some wonderful news! Ten Exchange students will be hosted in the District from July 2016. Of the 10 students, 8 are from Europe and then one each from Taiwan and Brazil.

And further good news, we currently have 8 Clubs hosting 7 students – Coromandel Valley, Mildura Deakin, Renmark, Strathalbyn, Noarlunga East, Mt Barker and Norwood/Magill Sunrise.

A plethora of youth Service activities exist in Rotary and pretty well all Clubs have some involvement with a youth program. There is an excellent PowerPoint presentation available for Clubs to show and involve their local schools. So often we hear that young people and their schools have not heard of what Rotary has to offer.

The recent Rotary Program of Enrichment (RYPEN) ran two programs, one held at Lake Cullulleraine and the other at Woodhouse in April. Both were outstandingly successful.

Thanks must go to the Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA)/RYPEN Committee chaired by John Sandham, to the RYPEN administrators, Stephany Martin and Damian Leach respectively and to Margaret Northcote who was the Registrar at both.

21 young people attended the camp in Victoria, a first to hold RYPEN away from Adelaide and 43 students enrolled for Woodhouse.

ARH Ambassador PDG Bob Aitken will be one of the Guest Speakers at a dinner on TUE 07 JUN at Kooyonga Golf


Club. Bob is best known for his tremendous service to Rotary Down Under over many years.

Thanks BlazeAid Hamley Bridge

More than 200 people packed into the Hamley Bridge Recreation Centre on 16 April to farewell the BlazeAid team, which had been in the district since 3 December. In that time nearly 300 people from around Australia had moved through the camp, volunteering their time to help people on properties affected by the Pinery fire. BlazeAid volunteers attended 152 properties, removed 250 kilometres of damaged fencing and erected 50 kilometres of new fencing.



Brian Koch spoke on behalf of the community and Vince Monterola spoke on behalf of the State Government to thank the volunteers and the Camp Coordinators, who are also volunteers, for their outstanding contribution. These volunteers not only helped to repair fences, they also gave people hope for the future and helped to lift morale by letting people know they were not alone and that others cared. Those volunteers present on the night received certificates of appreciation for their work. Camp Coordinators John Lilleco and Mary Howarth, who between them have given almost a full year of volunteer time, were each presented with a small gift to remind them of their time in South Australia amid thunderous applause from farmers and volunteers.

The Rotary Foundation and UNESCO-IHE Institute for Water Education are working together to tackle the world's water and sanitation crisis and are offering up to 10 scholarships for graduate study at UNESCO-IHE's Delft campus in the Netherlands. The partnership aims to increase the number of trained professionals who can devise, plan, and implement water and sanitation solutions in developing areas. The scholarships also are designed to promote long-term productive relationships between Rotarians and skilled water and sanitation professionals in their communities.

Scholars will receive a Master of Science degree in urban water and sanitation, water management, or water science and engineering. Graduates work with their Rotary club sponsors on a related project to benefit their local community. **The application deadline is 15 June**.
