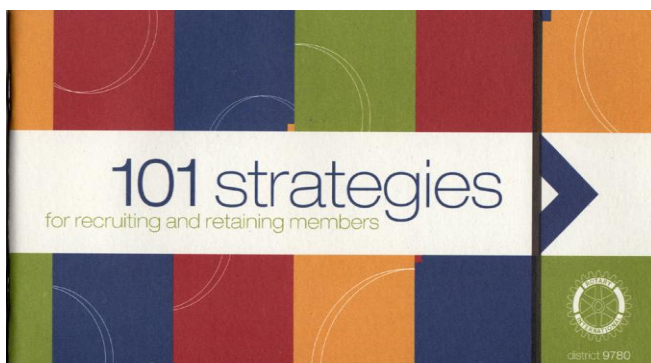
G'day friends,

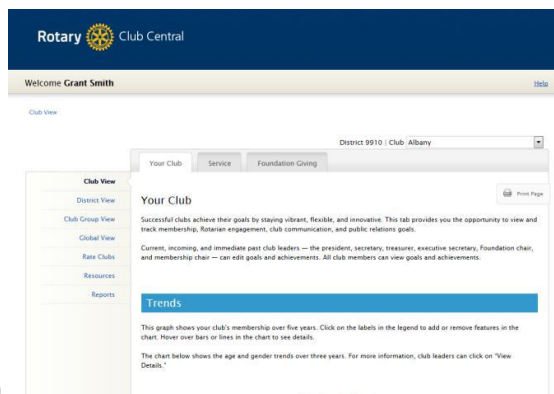
Click on yellow sign in box and the sign in screen appears. Log in using your email address. Create an account if you don't already have one

Step 6

To clarify terminology, **Every Rotarian Every Year** is what we refer to as **Centurion**. In this box enter the amount as \$US80 and enter the number of Centurions you want to achieve.

Other Contributions is what we refer to as **Club Annual Giving**, which should be \$US100 x the number of club members.

In addition you should enter a PolioPlus Fund goal of \$US20 per club member.
