The Rotary Foundation Focus, Issue 2 has been circulated to all Secretaries of Rotary Clubs in our District. The following Editorial from the Report has been posted for your interest.

There has been much activity in the areas of Grant applications over the first two months of this Rotary year. A lot of it has been uncharted territory but we have made much progress.

- The Grants committee has held a seminar on the 23rd of July to assist clubs interested in applying for Grants the District has submitted its Spending Plan to RI for approval of the nominated District Grants.
- Applications were received from twenty clubs and John Lewis and the committee have allocated the \$36000 of
 funds available to use on District Grants. The committee was impressed with the quality and variety of projects
 submitted for support. There were requests totalling \$86000 and so all projects were not able to be fully funded.
 A list of the recommended funding is given below.
- Clubs wishing to seek support for projects using a District Grant will now have to plan for next year's allocation. There are still funds available to support Global Grants which can be applied for on line without the deadlines associated with District Grants. These applications need to be made on line but clubs are advised to contact Grants Chair Bob Geekie, John Lewis or myself if considering applying for a Global Grant. Total value must exceed \$30,000.
