"Going Bush with Rotary" is a yearly program which is having great success engaging with young people and changing their lives. Program instigators Jim and Vicki Mason from the Rotary Club of Murray Bridge have established strong links with local public and private Primary Schools for them to invite selected Year 6 students, who are considered to be at risk, to be part of a week long learning exercise conducted by Rotarians in the far north Flinders Ranges. The program provides strong role models, and many situations where interpersonal skills and social skills can be developed, with opportunities for these young people to develop effective relationships with others. The success of this program relies upon the skills of Rotarians being able to significantly influence the way some young people in our community view the world and themselves. The main feedback relating the success of the exercise comes from the young people themselves, and from what their teachers report after the students return to their classrooms, and it is very often very positive.
