

2013 was a momentous year for Shelterbox. We responded to 25 disasters in 20 countries and brought shelter, warmth and dignity to over 13,000 families. Here in Australia, the response from Rotary and the public has been fantastic. We raised over **\$1 million** for our Typhoon Haiyan and Syria Refugee appeals and our SRT members were involved in deployments around the world.

At present we have SRT member, Greg Moran recently returned from the Philippines and newly deployed SRT members, Peter Pearce and SRT Anthony Keating, continuing our relief work in the typhoon-stricken country.

ShelterBox has committed to help nearly **8,000 families** in the Philippines and none of this would be possible without our fantastic donors. As our focus shifts back to the plight of the Syrian people, I'd like to thank you all for your support and wish you all the best for the coming year.

Philippines- Super Typhoon

ShelterBox Response Teams working in the Philippines have distributed **202 boxes**, **1,500 standard tents** and **16 midi tents**, helping **1,718** families in total. **225** toolkits have also been distributed in Leyte, enabling families to begin rebuilding their lives. ShelterBox will continue to work in the Philippines over the coming months

Lebanon-Syria Conflict

A shipment of **500 tents**, **1,000 blankets** and **1,000 solar lamps** have now arrived in country and are awaiting DHL Beirut to contact our implementing partners. **300 tents** are Al Pinter tents that allow for stoves to be used inside them, making them warmer than ShelterBox tents that do not allow this, so they will be distributed in the colder areas. **200 ShelterBox disaster relief tents** will be distributed to the warmer areas of the country. The deployment is being managed remotely due to the current unpredictable nature of Lebanon. **1,451 Boxes** distributed so far

Greetings from Evanston! As a reminder, the deadline for the Significant Achievement Award is **15 March**. The Significant Achievement Award recognizes Rotary clubs for outstanding community service projects. To be eligible, projects must:

- address a significant problem or need in the local community
- involve most or all of the club members in personal rather than monetary service
- be commensurate with the club's size and resources
- be capable of emulation by other Rotary clubs
- be currently active or reach a conclusion during the Rotary year for which the award is given
- be carried out by a single Rotary club

No club may receive the award more than once for the same project. District governors may select one outstanding project from the district and forward **one** nomination to RI for consideration, to arrive no later than 15 March 2014. Multiple nominations from a single district will not be considered. Please encourage your clubs to submit their nominations to you in a timely manner to enable you to meet this deadline.

Please note the nomination form is a writeable PDF that will allow you to type directly in the space provided. Nominations must be typed; handwritten nomination forms will not be considered. Please save a copy of your nomination form and then email it to riawards@rotary.org by 15 March.
