Urgent Appeal for help with our Cebu Philippines Project



MEDICAL EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES TO CEBU IN THE PHILIPPINES. TWO CONTAINERS ARE TO BE SHIPPED WEEK STARTING 17^{TH} OF MARCH.

As you may know, the Rotary Club of Kent Town has a project to send much needed medical equipment and supplies to the Visayas Community Medical Centre (VCMC) in Cebu. This area was one of many devastated by Typhoon Haiyan, and is still in dire need of materials for its rebuilding and rehabilitation. To this end, we have partnered with St. Andrews Hospital and Donations In Kind (DIK) to send two shipping containers of urgently needed medical equipment such as: theatre instruments, hospital beds, wheel chairs, shower chairs, linen, and a wealth of other items.

St Andrews Hospital and DIK are sourcing the equipment that we estimate to be valued in the range of \$150,000 to \$300,000. Once the goods reach Cebu VCMC they use it to replace equipment currently in use and then send the replaced equipment to its sister hospitals in the region.


