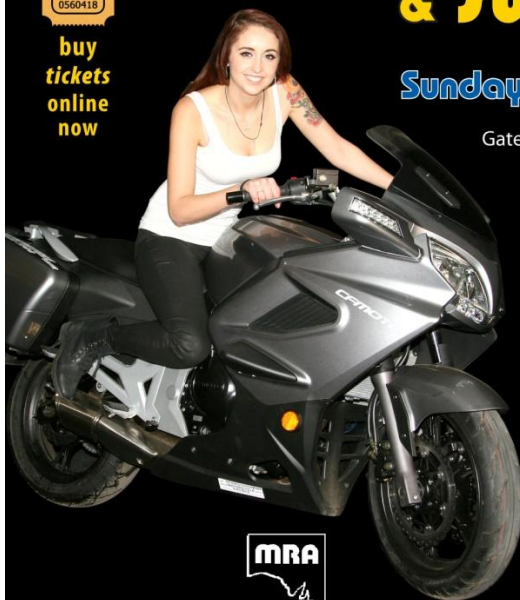

Rotary International Council on Legislation.

The Council on Legislation, Rotary's "parliament," meets every three years to deliberate and act upon all proposed enactments and resolutions submitted by clubs, district conferences, the General Council and Conference of Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland, and the RI Board.



The Council itself also makes proposals.

The most recent meeting of the Council has made a number of proposals to introduce changes that will be published in the next edition of RI Manual of Procedures, and a few examples are given below:

- Transfers between Clubs are now much easier with a letter of request and notification from previous Club saying there are no outstanding debts.
- Participation in club projects or other events can now be recognised as part of member attendance requirements
- Community members who may not have employment but have made a substantial contribution to raising their children can now be invited to join Rotary.
- Engagement and participation in Rotary programs now has a greater emphasis over attendance records.
