100 Million Reasons To Thank Australian Rotarians.

As all Rotarians around Australia should now know, the Hon Tony Abbott, Prime Minister of Australia, announced in his opening address to the 105th Convention of Rotary International in Sydney on 1st June that the Government has approved a commitment of \$100 million to the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI). Contributions will be at the rate of \$20 million per annum and will commence in the year 2014/15 for a 5 year period. Brian Knowles PRI Treasurer.

Sir Emeka, who is executive vice chair of the Chrome Group, has made contributions to Rotary's campaign to rid the world of this deadly disease totalling more than \$3.1 million, including a \$1 million gift he announced at the 2013 convention. He told the attendees at the third plenary session on Tuesday that his commitment to ending polio is a personal one.

RAWCS Rings for Limbs Project in Thailand.

The Rotary Club of Noarlunga East has offered to be the Southern Collection Point for Ring Pulls.

Ring pulls from soft drink cans are a valuable source of high grade aluminium metal. Monies raised from selling these ring pulls is used by the RAWCS organisation to fund the production of prosthetic joints and limbs. Distribution of the prostheses is managed by the Rotary Club of Thin Thai Ngam in District 3360 Thailand, and The Prostheses Foundation in Thailand.

The Prostheses Foundation was established in 1992 and is a free prosthetic service for amputees of any race, nationality or religion.

Many amputees are victims of landmine explosions, and a fitted prosthesis gives these people a renewed chance to live more productive and enjoyable lives.

2,500 ring pulls produce approximately 1 Kilogram of Aluminium from which 7 sets of joints can be made.
